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

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

### **HOUSE AUSTIN FIRST**

Dear Editor.

Thank you for addressing the number one issue facing Central Texas in the recently published editorial "Austin at Large: People Can't Live at the Bank" [News, March 18] discussing the Austin housing market and calling on local elected officials to prioritize an urgent response to the conditions of our market. We are echoing the call you're making.

ABoR takes this seriously and REALTORS® are working to help homebuvers and tenants across all price points – a challenge greater than it's ever been. With collective community action something can be done to address this complicated issue.

We must prioritize housing policy as the most important issue facing our community. We can't continue to get bogged down in competing priorities without a clear roadmap of what matters most and who's on first. Imagine Austin was our guide, but it's been nearly a decade since we

adopted that shared vision. The vision statement said we would be a city "of 'complete communities' that is natural and sustainable, prosperous, livable, mobile and interconnected. educated, creative, and which values and respects all Austinites." By my count, that's about nine things - none of which states we'll be a community with adequate housing supply.

Who will set our new North Star, and will they be bold enough to name housing the No. 1 priority? Voters will elect our next mayor this fall, and we hope they identify the candidate committed to addressing the housing affordability crisis. There is no "silver bullet" fix, but an "all of the above" strategy can go a long way to ensuring our market remains healthy, maintains a competitive affordability edge, and helps more people access the market.

We encourage voters to consider how their actions will impact this region in the short and long term. Choose the candidate that wants to house Austin first.

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



JUMPING TO CONCLUSIONS Texas foster care monitors say there is strong evidence that a **Texas Rangers** report ordered by Gov. Grea Abbott, which claimed abuse did not occur at a Bastrop County foster facility earlier this month, was "at best, premature," the Statesman reported. Nine employees at the Refuge Ranch were accused of sex trafficking foster girls after several reports alleged sexual and physical abuse.

AUSTIN AND THE BEANSTALK Developers Lincoln Property Co. and Kairoi Residential say they plan to start construction in the next few months on a 74-story high-rise at 98 Red River in Downtown's Rainey Street area. It would be the tallest tower in Austin and possibly all of Texas, the Statesman reported.

FREE EDUCATION FOR UKRAINIANS Ukrainian students at Texas A&M University System's 11 campuses and research centers will receive free tuition starting next semester. Chancellor John Sharp announced Tuesday. March 29. The Texas Tribune reported that the university system will also cover certain living expenses for the at least 14 students from Ukraine who have been identified as eligible so far.

DYING IN PRAYER The U.S. Supreme Court ruled on Thursday, March 24, that Texas likely violated the religious liberties of death row prisoner **John Ramirez** when it denied his request for his pastor to touch and pray over him during his execution. Ramirez's execution, once set for September, has been held up pending the court's decision. His death can now be rescheduled, so long as the Texas prison system changes its policies.

MEDICS CAN'T SELF-MEDICATE Random drug testing of public safety personnel for substances including THC will continue in Austin, although some city officials say the testing is inconsistent, Community Impact Newspaper reported. Last year's House Bill 1535 in the Texas Legislature permits prescriptions of THC for conditions including cancer, epilepsy, and post-traumatic stress disorder.

TORNADO RECOVERY GOES ON Hundreds of Williamson County residents are still recovering after tornadoes touched down in Central Texas. On Tuesday, a multi-agency resource center opened at the Williamson County Expo Center in Taylor to assist tornado survivors in Bastrop and Williamson counties, KXAN reported.

ALARMS GOING OFF? GET HELP An investigation from Austin Water into the causes of the February boil water notice echoed their initial assessment. Orange Team members did not appropriately respond to deteriorating plant conditions despite logs and multiple alarms that showed an issue throughout the shift. They failed to reach higher-ups for help with the worsening water quality conditions, the report found.

# **Taking Our Toll**

New toll booths on I-35 will benefit transit, TxDOT, and the Chronicle

I've written here before about the fact that the Chronicle office building is in the condemnation zone for TxDOT's planned I-35 expansion ("Public Notice: Condeming the Chronicle?" Sept. 10,

2021), along with some 130 other businesses up and down the highway. And while the Texas Department of Transportation seems intent on moving ahead with their preferred "Build Alternative 3," city planners and transit boosters continue to question the project, both in general and in its particulars.

And in the Chronicle's case, there's also an issue with the historic status of the building – once home to the Elgin-Butler Brick Co., one of the oldest businesses in the city. And that turned out to be key. With the help of the Arron Badler law firm, which specializes in condemnation cases, we

were able to convince the state that the building should not be demol-**PUBLIC** ished, but incorporated into the NOTICE design. It's taken a while to get to this point, but I'm happy to

announce an agreement which we expect to finalize this Friday, April 1, that will not only enable us to stay in our building, but will provide an ongoing funding source not just for the Chronicle, but for the highway

itself, while also furthering the goals of the

both the city and the local transit authority. It turns out that the solution - hammered

out in negotiations between the Chronicle, TxDOT, and Capital Metro - is as old as antiquity: a toll booth. Or in fact a whole new toll system, centered on the Chronicle building, perfectly located on the northern end of the most congested part of the interstate. And while the Chronicle has historically opposed toll roads as being "an inefficient, backwards approach to providing public highways," as the National Motorists Association puts it, it turns out that when properly designed and implemented, they can be a big benefit to the community.

### THE PERSONAL TOUCH

What makes this toll design so unusual – and so uniquely Austin – are the toll booths themselves. Most modern toll roads have done away with booths altogether, in favor of a supposedly more efficient but completely impersonal system of license plate scanners and automatic billing that has led to some outrageous stories of overcharging and mistaken identities. But the ChronToll system bucks the trend, and doubles down on the toll booth experience, aiming to bring a personal touch to each interaction. Part of that is the staffing: The intent is to recruit heavily among performers and the arts community, who can bring

a more lively feeling to the customer experience. To that end, TxDOT has pledged to keep wages low, to stay in keeping with the service-industry vibe that musicians and other creatives are used to. And there may be guest celebrity booth operators from time to time - either Chronicle staffers ready to talk about the issue, as shown in the photo at the top of this story, or other figures from around town, sitting in for a few hours of face time with the motoring public.

And handing out papers. Along with the building staying, this is the biggest part of the agreement for the *Chronicle*: Distributing copies of the paper to potentially 200,000 cars per day will instantly make us one of the largest-circulation mag-

azines in the nation, putting us in the same league as titles like *Martha Stewart Living* and *American Rifleman*. We're aware that not all those drivers might want to take a copy of the paper – especially the commuters who might be coming through 10 times a week – but as an incentive, TxDOT has agreed to allow a \$1 discount on the toll for those who take a paper – making us the first paper in the nation to actually pay people to take a copy. (Though we won't be the last; *Editor & Publisher* magazine has already tweeted that the "negative cover price [is] the future of journalism.")

And speaking of dollars, that's another innovation in the customer experience, because ChronToll doesn't use any traditional credit card systems; instead,

payment will be accepted in either dollar coins, or in Chroins, a new cryptocurrency we're launching as part of the project. Chroins could be a whole story of its own; suffice to say, you can see the start of that marketing campaign in ads elsewhere in the issue. But the dollar coins are an idea cooked up in Washington, D.C. The U.S. Treasury Department is excited about getting those back in circulation, and the mint is getting in on the action as well, issuing a new

2022 dollar coin with the interstate highway system on one side, and Transportation Secretary **Pete Buttigieg** on the other.

So instead of just a drive-through, and getting your picture taken by a robot camera, with ChronToll you get something

tangible for your money, along with maybe a chat about the latest news or a tip about a hot band. And if you're thinking that all sounds very time-consuming, and not the quickest way to get traffic through the toll area – well, it turns out that's a feature, not a bug.

### CONNECTING WITH PROJECT CONNECT

This all fits perfectly with Capital Metro's ambitious Project Connect plan, according to CapMet planner **George Mareski**, who asked that he not be identified. "The whole

idea is to get people to use transit instead of their cars, right?" said Mareski, after being assured that his comments were off the record. "Well, there's two parts to that. No matter how well you make transit work, it's never going to match the convenience of hopping in your car and driving right to where you want to go - unless traffic's really bad and you can't park anywhere; then the bus starts to look like a better option. And it's a lot easier to move the needle on that side than it is on the transit side. Here's an example: Say

someone's trying to decide whether to drive or take the bus. One \$200 no-left-turn sign can add three minutes to the amount of time it takes to run an errand in your car. Compare that to what it would cost to cut three minutes off of the bus trip – well, you probably can't even do that. So really, a lot of our focus is on making car trips slower and more difficult. This is still off the record, right?"

Mareski went on to describe a task force he was part of, which I should note Project Connect denies all knowledge of; however, Mareski showed me a graphic (below) which he said came from that task force, illustrating how many more cars can fit on I-35 if it's stopped bumper-to-bumper than if cars are zipping by at 65 miles an hour. "If you can turn I-35 into a parking lot," he said, "that's a big win for us." Not only might some of those drivers be convinced to use transit for their next trip – there's also the sheer number of cars that are being taken off of the city streets. To the

north, traffic will likely be backed up to well past Round Rock at most times of day. If they're bumper to bumper, that could be as many as 10,000 cars or more that won't be on city streets. And to the south, where most of the businesses being displaced are, the task force envisioned that the toll-induced slowdown could open up a whole new range of services, catering to the drivers literally parked at their storefronts. For instance Stars Cafe, one of the businesses in the crosshairs, could flourish and find a whole new clientele by

serving curbside coffee or even migas.

Overall, the schedule remains unchanged, with construction scheduled to begin in late 2025. Now that the design is completely finalized, TxDOT will begin a robust public input process, for both stakeholders and the general public. Interested parties should sign up at my35capex.com/input.

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## **DACC** Decisions

Council delays vote on community court relocation to study alternate sites, service model

Where the **Downtown Austin Community** Court should be permanently located remains up in the air, as City Council punted on making a decision for the fourth time in as many months. At last week's meeting, March 24, Council members were posted to vote on three items that would authorize spending \$27 million to renovate the old

City Hall building at 124 W. Eighth, now referred to as the Municipal Building, that staff identified as the most suitable permanent location for the court.

But facing pressure from groups such as the Downtown Austin Alliance. surrounding businesses, and people who live at the **Brown Building**, a multifamily development about 200 feet from the proposed site, Council withdrew consideration of the items - without any clear indication of when they

would return to the dais. Staff will provide Council with information requested at prior meetings before a vote occurs.

Some of that information will include how the **One Texas Center**, where the DACC is temporarily located, should be used in the future. CM Kathie Tovo has long eyed that building, at 505 Barton Springs Rd., as the best site to obtain affordable housing in the South Central Waterfront plan that is currently in the planning stage. Mayor

Steve Adler, on the other hand, isn't opposed to DACC remaining at OTC permanently, if staff concludes that it makes the most sense for them to be there.

Staff will also consider moving DACC to the Waller Creek Center at 624 E. 10th, where Austin Water's administration building is currently located. DAA and other oppo-

> nents of the move to the Municipal Building favor relocating to WCC, saying it could cost less to renovate. But doing so would require relocating the water utility's entire workforce to a new building; it's unclear how much the renovations and relocations would cost, or if it's even possible given the need for AW employees to operate specialized systems on-site to maintain the city's water supply.

Established in 1999, DACC serves two functions: an actual court-

house where anyone cited for certain class C misdemeanors, which include public intoxication, criminal mischief, or theft, within the jurisdictional boundaries of the court (Downtown as well as parts of East Austin and West Campus) can adjudicate the offense. It also handles citations for certain city code violations that occur within the same geographical boundaries, such as solicitation or public camping, which ties into DACC's other function: a provider of services to people experiencing homelessness.

DACC offers day services such as help signing up for benefits like food assistance or replacing a state ID card, available to anyone who walks into the building looking for help. in addition to Intensive Case Management, which requires joining a lengthy waitlist of people who wish to be paired with a social worker who can help them secure permanent housing. Both the court and services sides of DACC have made the city agency a critical player in the broader network of governmental entities, nonprofit organizations, and faith groups that make up the Austin-Travis County homelessness services system.

DACC relocation began in 2018 after staff learned the lease at 719 E. Sixth, the court's home for 20 years, would not be renewed; after studying 22 potential sites, staff recommended the Municipal Building early this year. Primarily, DACC needs a facility that can offer 22,000 square feet to support the court and service functions, and that is located within its jurisdictional boundary.

One Texas Center, which is temporarily housing Downtown **Austin Community Court** DAA has also pushed Council to examine

ways in which the DACC service model can be improved. "We need to look at what the opportunities are for the court to operate very differently within the homeless services system," DAA Vice President of Investor Relations Bill Brice told the Chronicle in a recent interview. With an unprecedented level of funding for homelessness services coming to Austin and Travis County thanks to the American Rescue Plan, Brice argues now is an opportune time to "rethink what the court should be."

This push from DAA has come as somewhat of a surprise to staff at DACC, who feel the roughly 35 individuals walking in for services on any given day and the 369 people placed into housing since 2015 are well served by the court's current model. Still, staff will consider potential changes, such as opening satellite locations around town and expanding the existing jurisdictional boundary for some offenses. Tovo and staff agree, though, that whatever changes are made, DACC must be headquartered Downtown, where most of the population of unhoused people it serves resides.

"Satellites should not be used instead of a home base," DACC Administrator Peter Valdez told Council at the March 24 meeting. "A home base is going to be necessary and it should be central and convenient for the population we are serving. We've always been Downtown. It is where people know we are located."

Mayor Steve Adler requested that, after staff has gathered more information, City Manager Spencer Cronk schedule a Council work session to discuss the matter. It is unclear when that meeting will occur, but it will include city staff as well as other affected stakeholders. "I want to hear from people who run the court and service providers about a permanent location before making a decision," the mayor told us.

### **Local Officials Appear at Starbucks** to Support Unionization Effort

"You can count on me come January 2022 to put my name on the PRO [Protecting the Right to Organize] Act," Casar said, "to make sure we put workers before profit." He was joined by Rep. Lloyd Doggett, state Sen. Sarah Eckhardt, Mayor Steve Adler, and Council Members Vanessa Fuentes. Ann Kitchen (next to Casar in the photo), and Kathle Tovo, among others. A Starbucks worker/organizer spoke last: "We are here today because of what Buffalo [N.Y.] got started ... one of the most exciting labor movements in the last several decades. I'm grateful to you all for standing together with us, and giving us what we're trying to achieve in our workplace, which is a voice." The crowd then ordered coffees under the moniker "Union Strong."



### **MetroBike Gears Up for Revamp After Major Outage During SXSW**

MetroBike, Austin's public bikeshare system, was forced to shut down service between March 17 and 19 due to a software issue. The outage occurred during the peak of **South by Southwest** – their busiest week of the year - raising questions about the service's reliability under pressure.

A statement from representatives of Austin Transportation, Bike Share of Austin, and **CapMetro** said that software glitches caused MetroBikes to "not be properly checked in at the end of a session, resulting in improper billing," and bikes were rendered "unrentable because the system [could] not recognize them as returned and ready to use." The number of glitches became too challenging for staff to mitigate as demand during SXSW surged, they said, driving staff to take the system offline.

MetroBike was eventually able to resume a "limited degree" of service, but the system is still not yet in its optimal working condition. according to the spokespeople. It's fixable, but the timing could make that fix expensive, said Hill Abell, a member of the Bike Share of Austin Board of Directors and longtime leader of Bike Austin. "CapMetro is ready to spend several million dollars on buying more equipment, and if they can't get this problem fixed in pretty short order, the city is going to require the system to go out and get RFPs [requests for proposal] for potentially another vendor. That would be really painful ... because that's setting up brand-new systems, docks and everything else, plus it would be a lot more money."

MetroBike operations involve several organizations: Austin Transportation owns the system, CapMetro oversees its design and planning, and Bike Share of Austin operates the system. The software system at the center of the operation is a product of **B-Cvcle**, a division of Trek. The bikeshare system - originally called Austin B-Cycle - went through a transition back in 2020, when the city of Austin partnered with CapMetro to integrate the

program into the Capital Metro transit system, prompting the name change to "MetroBike." That "was when we really started to get traction," Abell said. "Now that Capital Metro has taken over the management of the system it's the same people at B-Cycle running the system - but they're giving them so many more resources to work with, and it's made a world of difference." Trek has put "literally hundreds of millions of dollars" into developing the software system for the various markets they're in, Abell noted. "But unfortunately they learned a hard lesson about how stressing a software system can cause unintended consequences," he said.

Even with the glitches, MetroBike has seen increased demand throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. They have about 800 bikes and e-bikes in operation with 78 stations. And it's e-bikes that are driving the demand, generating "about four to five times the number of trips as manual bikes," the PIOs said. "The pedal-assist bikes are just absolutely phenomenal," Abell added, "and such a game-changer for people who are not cyclists and for people who just want to use them as a transportation tool ... and it's such a good value - you can get an annual pass for the cost of two or three **Uber** rides halfway across town."

A MetroBike pedal-assist bike is more expensive to maintain and costs almost 2.5 times as much as one of their normal bicvcles, Hill noted. "But the quality is phenomenal, they're super sturdy and Trek has done a really good job in creating the bicycles," he said. "Where the real challenge has been is the software for the system."

Continuing to expand MetroBike helps the city with its Austin Strategic Mobility Plan. which aims to increase transportation affordability and provide more ways to get around the city safely, Abell said. "Once the whole system is built out and people see the connectivity that's available to them, it's going to see enormous usage." - Hannah Uebele

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# Corrupt Cop on the Chopping Block

APD officer helped domestic violence suspect evade arrest

Austin Police Chief Joseph Chacon announced in a disciplinary memo last week that he indefinitely suspended APD Officer Andrew Upton for helping the suspect in an alleged domestic violence assault evade arrest.

In the memo, Upton admits to writing a note to the suspect in the alleged assault intentionally out of view of his body-worn camera - telling him that if he entered his residence and shut the door, he couldn't be arrested. During the course of the Internal Affairs investigation that preceded Chacon's decision to fire Upton, the officer admitted to investigators that he knew what he was doing at the time was wrong, but he did so as a "shortcut" to what he deemed was the more just outcome. "I was concerned [Mr. NL] would be arrested because of policy," Upton told IA. "I was concerned that ... it didn't best serve justice that night that he go to jail and have [an] arrest on his permanent record."

But Upton's actions not only violated Austin Police Department policy, Chacon wrote in the memo, they could be criminal as well. "A preponderance of the evidence" indicates that Upton hindered the arrest or prosecution of Mr. NL - a class A offense under state law. "Upton admitted that he

committed each element of this offense, as he intended to hinder the arrest of Mr. NL, aided Mr. NL in avoiding arrest, and warned Mr. NL of his impending arrest," the memo reads. According to Chacon's memo, the incident has been referred to the Public Integrity Unit at the Travis County District Attorney's Office for potential prosecution.

The incident that resulted in Upton's indefinite suspension - i.e., his firing occurred during the early hours of Aug. 11, 2021, but details of the officer's conduct were just revealed in Chacon's 22-page disciplinary memo, published March 18 by the Office of Police Oversight. Officers responded to a "Trespass Urgent" 911 call made by a man, identified as Mr. NL in the memo, who claimed his girlfriend, identified as Ms. VS, was being physical with him and refused to leave his residence.

While Upton and two other officers, unnamed in the memo, drove to the scene, the call was upgraded to a "Disturbance -Hot Shot," which means someone is facing imminent threat to their life or safety. When they arrived, they separated Mr. NL and Ms. VS to collect statements from each. Both said they were involved in a physical altercation, although each offered differing ver-



sions of events – a typical challenge officers confront during domestic violence calls.

Mr. NL told Upton that his girlfriend hit him, but he did not feel any pain; Ms. VS, however, told the other officers that her boyfriend threw her against a wall, which injured her finger. Later, while still on the scene, Mr. NL told Upton that the dispute was over Ms. VS refusing his attempts to have sex with her. Mr. NL also told Upton that when he was making the 911 call, Ms. VS struck him with a glancing blow that didn't hurt. He responded by pushing her away, potentially injuring her finger in the process.

At this point under Texas law, enough probable cause had been established to

require an arrest. Mr. NL and Ms. VS agreed that one person, Ms. VS, was assaulted and injured - opening up Mr. NL to a potential charge of assault with injury, family violence. But the three responding officers were unsure, so they decided to consult their sergeant, Thuy Bayer, for advice.

While one of the unnamed officers consulted with Bayer, who has more than two decades of experience at APD, Upton returned to Mr. NL, who told him he was worried about being arrested. Upton, who was hired by APD in 2013, responded by surreptitiously writing Mr. NL the note. When the unnamed officer returned with Bayer's determination that they needed to

### AISD APPROVES NEW CHARTER PARTNER FOR MENDEZ

Several trustees and Superintendent Stephanie Elizalde explained they felt backed into a corner as they agreed to enter a partnership at Mendez Middle School with a new charter operator - the lone applicant to respond to the district's request for proposals. The March 24 vote to contract with Third Future Schools comes after the district announced in December that it would not renew its contract with the previous partner, the **Texas Science**. Technology, Engineering, and Math coalition. T-STEM had only one year left to increase the school's accountability rating above a C, or else the entire district would be at risk of takeover by the Texas Education Agency, a risk Elizalde said she wasn't willing to take. But, as Trustee Noelita Lugo wondered during the meeting, "if a school board or district bends to the will of a state agency ... then what's the difference?"

Lugo was the lone no vote, with the other seven board members voting to approve the new 1882 agreement.

During public comment, district watchdogs such as Ken Zarifis and Martin Middle School teacher Jamie Haynes asked that the vote be delayed so trustees could more thoroughly assess the more than 200-page contract, which was released only three days prior, "There may be few options in this scenario, but how AISD engages the community, employees and this board is in their power," Zarifis said. "If not, at what cost will we be turning over our beloved Mendez Middle School to an unvetted charter operator?" Elizalde said delaying the vote would be impossible because of the March 31 deadline imposed by TEA. Missing that would essentially force the district to take over the school itself, which she said would likely spread district resources thinner. "We do have quote-unquote other options, just none of them are good," Elizalde said, including the option of closing the school. The announcement of the new charter partner comes just weeks after the district announced that it would close sixth grade at both Mendez and Martin middle schools, a

move that communities at both schools felt was edging closer to that outcome.

Third Future is a Colorado-based company with public school partners in Colorado and Texas, including Odessa, Midland, and Ft. Worth. Both critics and several trustees also raised concerns that all of the board members overseeing the company's Texas schools are located in other cities. Founder and CEO Mike Miles, who was present at the Thursday night vote, tried to alleviate those worries, explaining that all schools have a parent advisory committee to make suggestions to the administration. In Colorado schools, he said, there are also school accountability committees.

Under the new agreement, staff currently employed at Mendez will not necessarily be working there next year; Elizalde assured that they will be offered jobs at other schools and given the option to apply for positions at the charter school. Per an addendum to the agreement, the charter school's starting salary is \$70,000, much higher than the district's, which is around \$50,000 for middle schools. However, those positions may come with additional requirements and may lack some benefits programs. - Morgan O'Hanlon arrest Mr. NL, Upton tore out the note to Mr. NL from his notebook and disposed of it. When the officers knocked on Mr. NL's door to make the arrest, Mr. NL did not respond. They couldn't make an arrest, so the officers and Ms. VS eventually left the scene.

Upton, who is appealing Chacon's firing decision, told no one that night about the note: in fact, were it not for a follow-up call made by a counselor within APD's Victim Services Division, Upton's conduct may have never come to light. During the fol-

low-up VSD regularly conducts with alleged victims of violent crime. Ms. VS said, "This is why I don't like police or why I don't trust police," the counselor recalled. This alarmed the counselor, prompting her to ask Ms. VS why she said that.

Ms. VS said that after police left, Mr. NL called Ms. VS to tell her about Upton's actions, which helped him evade arrest. "He feels like he got away with hurting me,

because of that," the counselor remembered Ms. VS telling her. The counselor concluded that Mr. NL may have told Ms. VS about Upton's actions as a way of discouraging her from contacting the police in the future. "I think he used that against her to make her feel like if you report [alleged abuse] nothing's gonna happen to me," the counselor said during her IA interview.

Based on Chacon's memo, he. Bayer, and the Victim Services counselor were all disturbed by Upton's actions because they could have placed Ms. VS at further risk and because "as a consequence of this experience, Ms. VS may be demoralized or discouraged from reporting future crimes to police," the memo said.

Liz Donegan, a retired sergeant from APD's Sex Crimes Unit and current co-chair of the Austin/Travis County Sexual Assault Response and Resource Team, said what disturbed her most was how Upton single-handedly moved the investigation in a different direction. "He knew the law well enough to exploit it in a

> way to benefit someone suspected of domestic violence," Donegan told the Chronicle. "He actively helped the suspect, which is the complete antithesis of what law enforcement needs to do with victims."

> The incident is especially troubling given the broken trust between survivors of sexual assault and APD following years of scandal in how the department has responded to sex crimes.

Donegan said it is likely that Upton's actions don't represent APD's broader attitude toward sex crimes, with Chacon committed to improving as chief, but it is also a reflection of the work APD still needs to do.

If there is one silver lining this incident reveals, it's the important role APD's Victim Services Division must play in that ongoing work. "Thank god that the victim felt comfortable sharing this information with the Victim Services counselor," Donegan told us. "Otherwise this incident would have gone unnoticed."

Austin Water's aquifer storage project steams ahead

After the third boil water notice in four vears this February. Austinites are pondering ways to keep potable water on hand in case the water supply again proves unreliable. One such plan - the Aquifer Storage and Recovery Project (ASR) - has been in the works at Austin Water since the 2018 creation of the Water Forward Plan, a compendium of strategies for conservation and reuse for the next 100 years made in response to the 2008-16 drought, which

reduced the Highland Lakes to historically low levels. On March 24, AW held the first of many planned town halls relating to ASR, which should store enough treated water in a nearby aguifer by 2035 to significantly bolster available supply in the event of another drought or freeze.

ASR essentially captures stormwater in times of plentiful rainfall to store under-

ground, and pumps it back out during times of drought or other emergencies like a water savings account, as AW describes it. ASR projects, which have proved successful in Kerrville, El Paso, and San Antonio, have many benefits, explained project leader Kristi Shaw: "Storing water underground in a natural aquifer prevents high evaporative losses that reservoirs experience in a warm climate, and is more cost effective than other similarly sized

storage options." To protect the aquifer's health, water will be treated before it is pumped in, and then again when it comes out, to ensure it is compatible with the existing supply. The Carrizo-Wilcox and Trinity aguifers have been identified as contenders for the project, and a location will be finalized by 2023 after a geological survey, "based on not only aquifer considerations, but also endangered species, regulatory issues, and the distance to integra-

tion at Austin Water's system." said Shaw.

From 2024 to 2027, AW will pilot a small-scale version of ASR and in 2028 will begin design and construction on the full-scale version, with a projected end date of 2035. Based on the Water Forward Plan, the aquifer will include 60,000 acre-feet of storage by 2040. "For context," noted project manag-

er Helen Gerlach, "the whole city of Austin used about 160,000 acre-feet in 2021 over the whole year. And that would be expanded out toward the end of the century, to have up to 90,000 acre-feet per year available by 2115."

People who tuned in to the meeting had several questions, mostly related to who can claim water ownership: One listener asked about interaction with groundwater conservation districts, which manage groundwater, The Aguifer Storage and Recovery Project that will hold water for emergencies, such as a drought or freeze PROVIDED BY AUSTIN WATER

to which AW replied that if the location they choose is within a GCD, they will "share information ... and work with them." Another asked if pumping would affect nearby farming and ranching operations - "I depend upon my water well for my livelihood and [when] a big operation [is] pumping water, my well goes down." AW promised that ASR "will never take out more water than was stored in the aquifer ... We'll never be removing groundwater that was already [there]." Treated stormwater that would be used in ASR is also subject to the rule of capture, which in Texas means that landowners can harvest any water that's under their land, regardless of the effects on nearby wells or aguifers. AW says it's a "key con-

sideration, and as we identify locations, we'll be looking at different strategies to make sure that we are able to protect our water," such as buying the land above the aquifer and leasing it out to farmers and ranchers.

Jye Turk, AW's discussion moderator, clarified that "we are still in the very early stages" and promised that AW will be "working with the community throughout the process to share updates and gather feedback." Before the Zoom split into smallgroup discussions, the listener with the pumping question said, "I think the idea of reusing water sounds wonderful. But sometimes the devil is in the details.'

### **Doggett Secures \$2M for Mental Health Map**

On March 21, Rep. Lloyd Doggett, D-Austin, announced that he has secured \$2 million in federal appropriations for the new Central Texas Community Mental Health Surveillance Collaborative, a project that aims to create an interactive map of mental health data similar to local COVID dashboards. The project, one of 10 chosen from a community project funding request, is being designed by Texas State University's Dr. Melinda Villagran and Dr. Alessandro De Nadai. Villagran says when the pandemic hit in March 2020, she was struck by the simple visual language of COVID dashboards: "There's a lot of data available, but very few of us have the bandwidth to look at it, find it, understand it, and use it every day. I found it to be a visual way to make sense of what was happening. And I thought, man, we need one of these for everything!"

Since the pandemic began, mental health issues have been on the rise in certain communities - including teachers, parents with kids at home, and health care professionals. Villagran saw the need to comprehensively map where issues are occurring and where there are resources nearby. "To be very clear, we are not using private health data. Our goal is not to violate any individual's confidentiality, but rather to look at things in a more community-level way, such that we can understand issues that are happening and see how they change over time."

Villagran has already partnered with Austin Public Health and groups in the Hill Country, San Antonio, and Comal and Hays counties, among others. She uses APH's open data portal to look at the social determinants of mental health issues, using data from "hospital admissions, EMS, people going through the court system. There are indicators that are really closely associated with mental health challenges, and there are others that might or might not be, but when you find where they overlap, that's more clear than if we didn't look at all of [them] together."

The map will include the I-35 corridor between Round Rock and San Antonio, with data from Travis, Hays, Comal, and Bexar counties. Villagran stresses that unlike federal data for metro service areas, which would isolate Austin from San Marcos, for example, she wants her map to be integrated: "In reality, increasingly, people live and work between San Antonio and Austin. They live in New Braunfels, and they work in Austin. They live in Austin, and they work in San Marcos. The reality is that where we live and work is linked."

In a press release, Doggett says the map tool will prove useful for "public health planners, school counselors and veterans' assistance groups," but Villagran adds that policymakers especially will benefit from the resources component. "There is nothing that I know of that links a need with the resources available to address that need, so you can see those two things happening together in the same community. Like a COVID dashboard, we will not seek to tell people how to interpret the information, we will be creating a simple place to find the information. So if you're a clinician or policymaker, you can stay up to date." - Lina Fisher



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# The Trouble With **Tank Farms**

East Austinites who saw the health impacts of a tank farm in the 1990s push back against airport proposal

In September of last year, Amanda Carrillo, a 40-year-old mother of four who lives in a home on McCall Lane in Southeast Austin, opened up her mailbox to find a letter from a local developer. It told her that **Austin-Bergstrom International Airport** was planning to build a new multimilliongallon fuel storage site - across the street from her house.

Carrillo was stunned. Though the plan for the new fuel storage site had been approved by City Council back in 2018, this was the first she was hearing about it. She wasn't alone. "I went door-to-door and found out that nobody in my community knew about anything," said Carrillo, who grew up in the working-class neighborhood. "Never received any notifications ever. ... They had no clue."

Now, just months before the airport is hoping to begin construction on the new fuel storage facility, an effort led by neighbors like Carrillo to halt it due to health concerns

is gaining steam - setting up the coming weeks as a major test of the city's stated commitment to environmental justice.

For airport officials, the new fuel storage site is a must-have. AUS acting Communications Director Sam Haynes said that while most airports typically have a five- to seven-day fuel supply on hand, AUS only has a two- to three-day supply.

The question is not whether the airport, at its current rate of growth, needs more fuel storage capacity. The question is where that capacity should be built.

"When it comes to airport planning, we have to look at all of our available space within our footprint, and when you factor in current land use, when you factor in the floodplain, when you factor in existing structures and bumper zones for navigational aid, FAA facilities, it kind of becomes a process of elimination for where projects best fit," Haynes said.

With those constraints in mind, the airport



decided to build the new site along U.S. 183 between McCall Lane and Metropolis **Drive** – despite the fact that there are numerous houses along McCall Lane and on adjoining Seeling Drive, as well as a VA clinic and another housing development nearby.

The plan received little pushback from the community for years, largely, Carrillo and neighbor Frieda Jones said, because people weren't aware of it. City Council Member Vanessa Fuentes, who represents

Southeast Austin, said that skipping early, robust public engagement reflected the city's lack of understanding of the largely Hispanic neighborhood, where many people aren't available during the workday to tune in to city meetings.

In recent months, however, public engagement has skyrocketed - with neighbors almost universally expressing their opposition to the airport's plan over concerns that it would put their health at serious risk. Some residents are motivated by

### **Challenges to SB 8 Forge On; Abortion Funds Face Legal Threats**

Though pro-choice Texans have lost a few battles to Texas' near-total abortion ban, Senate Bill 8, in the last few weeks, there is still a fight left. After the U.S. Supreme Court in December and Texas Supreme Court in March together threw out all the viable paths for a case against SB 8 brought by Whole Woman's Health and other plaintiffs, two newer legal challenges could still thwart people who try to use SB 8 to sue anyone who "aids and abets" an abortion after six weeks of pregnancy. "It's an ongoing crisis with no end in sight," said the Center for Reproductive Rights' Marc Hearron, who was lead counsel on the Whole Woman's Health case.

Hearron points out that the courts have so far permitted SB 8's bounty hunter model - allowing private citizens to sue as a workaround of constitutional rights. That precedent has the potential to unravel our justice system and constitution, he said; in fact, a gun rights group submitted a brief to the U.S. Supreme Court in support of abortion providers,

which argued that if the vigilante law is allowed for abortion, later it could block gun ownership.

Two Texas abortion funds that help patients pay for abortion-related expenses - Texas Equal Access Fund and Lilith Fund - have filed suits aimed at SB 8 in federal court that could potentially reach SCOTUS. They argue, among other things, that SB 8 violates abortion advocates' right to free speech by preventing them from communicating openly to clients and donors.

Javlynn Farr Munson, communications director for Austin-based Fund Texas Choice, said the nonprofit has not yet filed suit but is in for a potential court battle after receiving a cease-anddesist letter from state Rep. Briscoe Cain, R-Deer Park, which claims that "your organization is committing criminal acts." Cain posted the letter to social media, which Munson said was meant to scare donors out of supporting the organization. In addition to Fund Texas Choice, Cain addressed the letter to the North Texas Equal Access Fund,

the gruesome effects of a tank farm that for decades was located in East Austin near the intersection of Springdale Road and Airport Boulevard. It was ultimately removed in the 1990s, but not before residents experienced a range of ailments including asthma, skin rashes, lesions, and cancer that they believed were connected to extensively documented air, soil, and water pollution. Their property values also plummeted.

"Native East Austinites have been fighting the overabundance of industrial zoning in East Austin for decades," said Bobbie Garza-Hernandez, a communications strategist with Pink Consulting and former aide to Mayor Gus Garcia. "This is just one more."

Airport officials see it differently. In a memorandum sent to the mayor and City Council members in mid-March, airport CEO Jacqueline Yaft wrote that there is no parallel between the East Austin tank farm and the proposed airport fuel storage site, due both to the type of fuel slated to be stored at the new site and a range of enhanced safety and regulatory measures. But many East Austinites remain skeptical that health effects can be completely mitigated by safety measures, or even fully known before the site is built.

Now, the two sides are in a standoff. Haynes said that the currently proposed site is the only one that fits the airport's criteria, while Fuentes has proposed a resolution to relocate the site, which the City Council will discuss in April. Thus far, she said, only Council

Members **Chito Vela** and **Kathie Tovo** have committed to supporting the resolution.

"It has been challenging to get enough support to get on the agenda," Fuentes said. "For me, it begs the question of, if this was happening in another part of Austin, would it be this difficult?"

But the activists do have some reason for optimism. Garza-Hernandez said she believes that an increased focus on racial equity and environmental racism in recent years has made a difference, while the city of Austin itself, which adopted a Climate Equity Plan last year, has stated that it understands the ways in which environmental risks are unevenly distributed throughout the city.

The city council's approach to Fuentes' resolution and the proposed fuel storage site will send a signal about that commitment to climate equity – as well as about whom Austin's runaway growth will benefit and whom it will likely harm.

"Where are we going to go?" Carrillo said. "Austin is getting so expensive. We understand the growth, but we worked hard to make this our home, and then you're going to come and not tell us crap and put this here?"

For the community members and activists opposing the plan, that is the key question. "We were here first," Carrillo said. "We were here before you. We deserve to live in a healthy environment, and we're not going to go anywhere. We're going to keep on fighting, because this is ours. You may have money, but we have voices ... We're small, but we'll fight back."

Lilith Fund, the Afiya Center, Frontera Fund, the West Fund, and Clinic Access Support Network. "If they can't close us down, they'll try to basically starve us of funding," Munson said.

Attorney **Jennifer R. Ecklund** responded on behalf of all the recipients, telling Cain that SB 8 was void from its inception because of its unconstitutionality (federal and Texas law back this up, as does a Texas judge's December ruling). Therefore, his public accusation that the organizations are criminal is "false and defamatory" and posting the letters publicly "demonstrates that the defamatory effect of your words is intentional."

"I try not to look in the crystal ball too much because I'm frequently disappointed," Hearron said, "but I think the more this SB 8-style strategy happens, it seems like at some point the courts are going to wake up and say, 'This is not how constitutional rights are going to be treated in this country.' I don't know how long that's going to take."

Of course, that constitutional right itself may dissolve. The Supreme Court will likely issue a ruling by July on a Mississippi challenge to **Roe v. Wade**. "For us, it already feels

like a post-Roe world because [almost all] of our clients have to leave Texas," said Munson.

Funds have been serving more abortion-seekers than ever – before SB 8 went into effect, about 45 people a month called FTC, and that number has since risen to more than 300, Munson said. In-state options still exist, though many are illegal. Abortion pills can be ordered in a state with fewer restrictions and then sent (or even forwarded) to Texas. And national organization **If/When/How** offers free legal consultation through a helpline at 844/868-2812.

Whole Woman's Health founder **Amy Hagstrom Miller** told the *Chronicle* that, ultimately, public discussion of abortion needs to shift. Rather than focusing on life-and-death situations, she said, destigmatizing abortion means recognizing its overall value in our society. "To know that you could if you needed to, that's how multiple generations of people in this country have lived their lives now ... Helping people travel to a different state for an abortion – that's a Band-Aid. That's not the long-term solution. The long-term solution is to shift the culture that allowed these laws to happen."

# **Criminal Depression**

Austin man's suicide in iail after seeking medical care raises question: Why was he there? BY BRANT BINGAMON

If he had any remaining doubt that JJ needed hospital care, it surely evaporated as Mark Bell chased his brother down the I-35 access road on the evening of Feb. 7. Bell had been driving JJ to the Sobering Center on 12th and Sabine when his brother jumped from the car at a stoplight.

By then, Mark had spent eight hours trying to talk JJ down from a psychotic break. "I showed up to help and he was just out of his mind," Bell said. "He didn't know what was happening in the world. He kept asking me, 'What are we doing? What are we doing here?' He would ask me the same question a hundred times in a row."

Jared JJ "Joker" Bell, a widely loved figure in Austin's EDM scene, would have turned 33 in March. He was an artist and a musician with a gregarious personality who made friends instantaneously. But JJ also had a history of mental illness and drug use, so when Mark drove in from his home in Burnet to check on his brother, he wasn't completely surprised at his condition. As JJ cycled in and out of lucidity, Mark called different rehab facilities. Finally, he decided to try the Sobering Center, and after chasing his brother through Downtown for an hour, he got him there.

"The Sobering Center straight up tells me, 'We won't take him. We only work off of recommendations." Bell said. "I was like, 'So what do I got to do?' They said, 'Either the cops got to recommend him here or the hospital does.' So I went and took him to the hospital. And, you know, he was calm the entire time we were in the hospital. He was scared, like a child. He was very timid, but he was fine."

Bell checked his brother into the Dell Seton Medical Center. Before he left he spoke with a nurse. "I said, 'Look, my brother is a schizophrenic. And he is a drug addict.' I said, 'He's been out of touch with reality, probably for a few days now. And he's suicidal. You need to keep him here. You need to detox him. Sedate him, restrain him. Do not let him out of here until he is sober though,' And the nurse said, 'I'll take care of your brother.' I said, 'If you let him go, if he leaves this hospital, you need to let me know immediately. So I can be there."

The next morning, Bell received a call from the Travis County Sheriff's Office. He was working in Bastrop and didn't pick up but assumed that his brother had wound up at the jail. And it was true: Dell Seton had

called the police, perhaps when they learned that JJ had seven warrants out for his arrest. Bell missed two more calls that day as he worked in an area with poor cell service. The next day, on Feb. 9, he got another call from the sheriff that went through. "And they go, 'Well, we didn't want to tell you this over the phone, but your brother died in custody. We found your brother unresponsive. He killed himself.'

"And I was like, 'How? I left him in the hospital and then he was in jail. Was he on suicide watch?' And they were like, 'We don't have any details at this time.' And I ended up getting information within the week that my brother was in the hospital and apparently they ran his record or whatever, his name, saw he had warrants, and transferred him to jail without helping him. They just sent him to jail instead, while he was in a freaking suicidal drug psychosis. And my brother was out of his mind in there and scared and they said that they found him with his back against the wall, slumped down, with a telephone cord wrapped around his neck."

### THE JAIL

The death in custody report from the Travis County Sheriff's Office states that Jared Bell was admitted to the Downtown jail - as opposed to the larger one in Del Valle – on Feb. 7 at 11:27pm. During booking, he reportedly expressed suicidal ideation and was put on a suicide watch, with deputies visually checking on him every 30 minutes. On the morning of Feb. 9, he asked to make a phone call and was placed in an empty dayroom with a corded telephone at 9:19. An hour later, the corrections officer who had placed him there discovered Bell with the phone cord around his neck. Officers immediately began CPR; paramedics continued it when they arrived. Bell was pronounced dead at 11:07am, 36 hours after entering the jail.

In the last decade, suicide has become the leading cause of death in county jails, which, it's important to note, are different from state prisons: Prisons house inmates who are serving sentences for more serious offenses. County jails mostly contain inmates who have not yet been convicted of anything. Bell's suicide is the fourth in Travis County's jails in the last year. On April 30, 2021, Nicholas Vanwhye killed himself in his cell. On July 11, Alexander McFarland was found asphyxiated. And on Nov. 14, Adan Torres hung himself, was resuscitated, but died days later. Each of these men had coiled a bedsheet into a rope.

TCSO spokesperson Kristen Dark stresses that Travis County is not necessarily part of the rising trend of jail suicides. She told us there were four suicides in 2021. In 2020, the jail had none; in 2019, it had two. Meanwhile, from 2018 to 2020, deputies stopped 92 suicide attempts.

"I'm so proud of the men and women I work with here because the vast majority of people who attempt suicide in our jail [survive], thanks to their efforts," Dark said. "We have special housing for people who are suicide risks and their risk is assessed by our counseling and medical team. For some of our inmates, they do visual checks every 30 minutes. Other inmates, it's every 15 minutes."

Attorney Dean Malone, who specializes in bringing civil lawsuits on behalf of families of inmates who kill themselves in jail, said that 30-minute checks, or even 15-minute checks, aren't enough. "It is insufficient to put suicidal people on anything other than a constant or continuous watch," Malone said. "Why is that? Because it literally takes about three minutes, through use of a ligature, to kill yourself. People in cells will use grab bars – in holding cells, they have grab bars by the toilet. They will tie off jail clothing and, literally, all they have to do is lean into the ligature.

"The jails say, 'Hey, we're complying with Texas Commission on Jail Standards requirements and we're seeing these people once every 30 minutes.' Well, somebody can be dead for 25, 27 minutes before a check occurs."

The death in custody report doesn't state whether the officer who placed Bell in the dayroom on Feb. 9 made a visual check between the time he was left alone in the room - 9:19am - and the time he was discovered dead - 10:13am. And Dark said she can't comment on the case in detail, for a variety of reasons, including the rules in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act.

"I'm not able to speak on the specifics of many, if not all, of our suicide cases because of the fact that I can't reveal HIPAA information," Dark said. "So much of what happens

in those situations involves the health and the medical conditions of our inmates. I can't go there, that's private information. I can't give criminal history and I can't talk about anything related to their medical condition. I can't talk about why they were in the hospital or why they were released. And I can't talk about what medical care they received or what the medical team knew, when they're in our custody."

### THE HOSPITAL

Okay then, what can the hospital tell us about JJ Bell's brief stay at Dell Seton on the evening of Feb. 7? Why did hospital staff call the police on Bell rather than treating him?

The *Chronicle* tried to get in touch with media reps at Dell Seton. We called six times and left messages four times. But even if they had returned our calls, it's not likely they would have been able to tell us anything, for the same reason that Dark couldn't – HIPAA rules.

Whatever their rationale, Dell Seton's action was not unusual. "This is a real thing that happens to hundreds and hundreds of people," justice advocate Kathy Mitchell said. "People present themselves to the local hospital emergency room, the hospital calls the police, and the police take them to jail. Hospitals are not giving emergency mental health care, hospital-level care, and

they're calling the police on people in their own emergency rooms. It is an indictment against our health care system."

This view is more or less the consensus among advocates, health care providers, and even law enforcement. "I could talk about the mechanisms that folks are using to kill themselves and the problems with the use of ligatures," Malone said. "But here's the root of the problem: We are using jails in lieu of mental health treatment facilities to incarcerate generally – not always, but generally – low-level offenders. And these people have serious mental health issues.

"And what do we do? We lock them up in a metal box, with a concrete floor. And I think most sane people – those people without serious mental health issues – if you put them in that situation, it's going to lead to mental health issues."

Of course, mental illness in county jails – and everywhere – is very closely correlated with substance use disorders, because mentally ill people use illegal substances to self-medicate. A 2018 study found that 87% of county jail inmates – almost 9 out of 10 – had some kind of substance use disorder. A large number of these also suffered from mental health issues. Over 40% had experienced a major depressive episode or post-traumatic stress disorder; about a fourth had bipolar disorder; 15% had experienced psychosis.

Mitchell said that the illegality of certain substances has created a class of people who can legally be denied care. "If a person has a heart attack, the hospital isn't going to wait to decide if they also had some alcohol before they went in the front door. The hospital would never decline treatment for that heart attack because the person was also drunk. So we have created these categories of people that we simply don't provide the care for that we would provide under a range of similar circumstances."

Judge Andy Brown, who presides over the Travis County Commissioners Court – and, thus, indirectly, over the jail – is in the early stages of creating a facility that could accept patients like JJ Bell. "I met with the

Justice Department folks in Washington, D.C., recently and they cited a diversion center in Miami that they think works pretty well, not just for mental health diversion but also substance use disorder diversion," Brown said. "And their other example was in Tucson, Arizona. So we're going to look at both of those communities, look at how those work, and see if we can implement something similar."

Brown was instrumental in the creation of the Sobering Center, which, you will recall, was the first place Mark Bell took JJ. But it was a four-year process for Brown and his allies to establish the Sobering Center, so a diversion facility for those with substance use disorder won't be here anytime soon.

### JJ

"When he moved to Austin, my brother got into the music scene, the EDM

and all that," Mark Bell said. "And he made more friends than I ever knew you could make. When he died and all these people were telling me their condolences, I said, 'I've never even seen this many people. And he knows this many people?"

On a Saturday in late March, hundreds of JJ Bell's friends came together at Indra's Awarehouse to share their memories of him. Indra's is an old warehouse on the eastern edge of the city dedicated to art, music, dance, and expanded consciousness. It sits on an acre of scrubland and hosts EDM festivals and psytrance campouts.

As such, Indra's is a home base for Melanie Maxwell. Maxwell helped organize the memorial for JJ, whom she met running coffee and snack concessions at festivals across the state. "It can be really stressful, catering and getting set up to do festivals," Maxwell said. "I'm usually running late, I'm just not really present in the space yet. And he's someone that the second we would see him and connect with him, it was like, 'Okay, we're home. We're here, we're present.' He really helped to remind me, hey, we're in this community together. We're so fortunate to be together."

Dixon Stovall knew JJ for eight years and thought of him as his best friend. "JJ was this person that could show up wherever he was and have people ... laughing, singing, you know, playing card games. He was a joker. He was a jester, he was a modern-day jester. He stirred the pot in the most loving

way. Everywhere he went, he just radiated that to people."

Like most, Stovall met JJ at a music festival. They became closer as Stovall went through a painful divorce, when JJ dropped by Stovall's home and found him in a deep depression. "He said, 'I'm going to help you.' I said okay and he said, 'Sit your ass down on the couch.' And I was like, all right, and he comes back with a chiminea, which is like an outdoor wood burning thing. And he said, 'Are you okay with me getting rid of some of this stuff,' like pictures of my wife? And this dude is probably the only person I would allow to go in my home like that. And he burned every single thing. He took it and he put it outside in a chiminea and set it on fire.

"And as crazy as it sounds, that was the best thing anybody could have ever done for me at the time."

Story after story on Saturday made the point that JJ was there for his friends, but Stovall and others saw that he did not take care of himself, especially in the last months of his life. Stovall wept as he described those days. "I was trying to help JJ get clean. I knew he was sick and I knew he was going in a bad direction. And I feel bad because I kind of put my foot in his ass a week before he died. I was like, 'Man, I can't be your friend anymore if you don't get sober. You're hurting people around you, you're hurting yourself.' I was like, 'I love you but you gotta get some help, dude.' And next thing I know, I get a phone call and he's dead."

Maxwell has lost other friends to mental illness and drugs and says the criminal justice and health care systems need to find


ways to save people like JJ Bell. "His brother and Dixon and other friends were really there for him in all these ways but you can't stop somebody from doing their vices if they're not wanting to and especially if they're thinking this is the only thing managing their situation. And I feel like the jail system and the halfway house system, they're not equipped to handle people having these mental breaks. I think there needs to be a lot more resources put towards that."

Mark Bell wants to see the Travis County Jail held accountable. "What I want to know is, how is my brother, who was on suicide watch, left alone with access to a telephone cord? Why wasn't he in a cell where he didn't have anything to hurt himself? How are you gonna leave someone on suicide watch alone with a telephone cord? How long did he have to have been laying there with the telephone cord around his neck, to not just suffocate but to be unable for them to resuscitate him?"

Stovall says the Austin community should be able to handle crises like the one JJ experienced with delicacy and compassion. "What sucks about these situations is that society, law enforcement - whatever, the system, the social structure we live under - it's very black and white. You're either good or bad. And JJ was truly good. But I think the main lesson to be learned here is that, when someone's questioning their sanity and coming off drugs, how dare you go put him in a jail cell? And how dare you judge him as some criminal or some person that's harmful? It's just not fair. And it cost him his life. He's dead. I'll never get to talk to my buddy again."


# **Five Things**

The play profiles her virologist husband, Nathan Wolfe, portrayed by the Austin Playhouse's Ben Wolfe (surprisingly, no relation). Audiences follow Nathan through an extended compulsory monologue, in which he is forced by his wife's play.

in which he is forced by his wife's playwriting to tell the tale of his own grappling with mortality.

Nathan Wolfe is no amateur catastrophist, having been named one of *Time*'s 100 Most Influential People for his work in viral forecasting, and Austin Playhouse co-Associate Artistic Director Ben Wolfe is no amateur actor. Ben's embodiment of Nathan is serendipitous if not uncanny. For 80 uninterrupted minutes he is not Wolfe the Actor but Wolfe the Virologist, on


a mission seemingly motivated by survival to tell his tale of, well, survival. Though he's alone onstage, he relishes in the fact that he isn't alone in the room, assuming the nonexistence of a fourth wall by opening with the line: "What is this, an intervention?" His performance is enthused, anxious and

bodily, physically exudes every emotion Gunderson observed in her husband.

What's actually worth being afraid of? That question is posed by virologist Wolfe as he, in isolation, runs through a series of perspective-altering statistics about risk. His calculated paranoia combined

with his inability to escape the narrative realm his wife placed him in emotionally resonate in a way that would perhaps have been less palpable pre-pandemic. The protagonist clearly relies upon his work – his ability to literally predict and prevent catastrophe – for his sanity. Periodic chest pains, enhanced by immersive sound (Robert S. Fisher) and lighting design (Mark Novick), hint that the root of his fixation with disaster prevention is the inevitability of his own demise.

It's also serendipitous that this play marks Austin Playhouse's return to live, in-person performances after a three-year COVID hiatus – a return to art made possible by science. The play grapples with the perceived mutual exclusivity of science and art, portrayed through the protagonist's relationship



with his wife who takes him to plays when he's not busy hunting viruses. Wolfe is a fervent advocate for truth, which he believes is found in science and not theatre, until he must ultimately reconcile that some truths, like our innermost struggles, cannot be predicted by calculation.

Commissioned in 2020 as a virtual production by the Marin Theatre Company, *The Catastrophist* is an opening act to Austin Playhouse's live return but an encore to director and Austin Playhouse founder Don Toner's six decades of producing theatre. The company announced his retirement in a blog post last week, stating that *The Catastrophist* will be his final production. "It's such a joy to return to the theatre and to be

directing Ben Wolfe in a tour-de-force performance as well as working with Stage Manager Barry Miller," Toner stated in a press release. "The play moves beyond the worldwide catastrophes Nathan seeks to predict, to the personal ones that we often catch too late. It's this personal part of the story that I really connected with and I think our audiences will as well."

After three years away from audiences, Austin Playhouse is nothing if not aware of the privilege of participation in live theatre, one held by performers and patrons alike. *The Catastrophist* is undoubtedly worthwhile for anyone grateful for the science of viral forecasting, the art of playwriting, or a particularly fortuitous marriage of the two.

Yes, that is a real occupation. Professional artists travel from competition to competition hoping for a big payday of prize money like rodeo cowboys. Most are also working artists between contests.

Starting with a pile of beach sand, and using trowels, spray bottles of water, and puffs of air, the sculptors render the temporary statuary in surprising detail. A final thin layer of clear, biodegradable glue holds the shape against the wind. The project is done within a time limit in Master Duo, Master Solo, Semi-Pro, and Amateur categories.

In past years, Muhammad Ali, John Lennon, Abraham Lincoln, and all sorts of other celebrities, self-portraits, and unspecific people and creatures have made appearances at the beachfront art gallery.

In 2021, "Mind's Eye" (pictured) by Sue McGrew of Tacoma, Wash., attained the rare achievement of winning first place in the Master Solo and People's Choice categories.

The artists have moved away from sandcastles, but Texas favorites Christy McDonald Atkinson and her dad the Amazin' Walter **McDonald** are masters of arches and towers. The pair won the People's Choice award in 2018 and 2019 with their fanciful castles.

The festival has grown every year since it began in 1997 as a way to raise funds for local nonprofit organizations. Besides the sand



creations, there is music and vendors selling everything from beach jewelry to sno-cones.

Texas SandFest in Port Aransas is the largest native-sand sculpting competition in the country. This year's event happens between mile markers 8 and 13 on April 8-10. The best way to get there is on the shuttle bus.

#### Qualification for 2022 World Cup Just the Beginning for U.S. Men's National Team

When was the last time you thought about Qatar? Like, really thought about it. Can you point it out on a map? Name its capital city? Identify its flag? Don't worry if things are a little fuzzy in that department. In about nine months, the peninsular Persian Gulf nation will occupy more of your daily attention than you ever thought possible.

Why? Because the United States men's national team has qualified for the 2022 FIFA World Cup in Qatar! Cue the confetti poppers.

That fact in itself is well worth celebrating. Soccer enthusiasts who predate Austin FC in their footy fandom might remember the American men failing to land a spot at the 2018 edition of the world's most-watched sporting event. What followed were five difficult years of embarrassment, uncertainty, and insecurity. Missing out on a World Cup does funny things to the collective mental health of a nation's soccer culture.

In our case, it kept an ominous dark cloud over the five most exciting years ever for Americans finding success on the global soccer stage. U.S. players have spent the last half-decade making their mark on some of the biggest clubs on the planet, including Chelsea, Barcelona, Juventus, Borussia Dortmund, PSG, Valencia, and more. Those players, alongside a robust complement of more-than-capable MLS stars, combined over the past seven months to shepherd the Stars and Stripes to a *relatively* comfortable qualification campaign, even if flashbacks from 2018 often kept it from feeling as such.

For that, head coach Gregg Berhalter and his staff deserve plenty of credit. Transforming a diaspora of talented teens and twentysomethings into the core of a formidable national team is much easier said than done, and Berhalter managed it without compromising his brand of aggressiveness, which led directly to two strong performances (a home win and a road draw) against archrivals Mexico.

Put all of that together, now that the qualification hurdle is in the rearview, and stateside fans can finally allow themselves to get excited about what this U.S. team might realistically achieve in Qatar. At 11am on Friday, April 1, the official World Cup draw will take place and the American squad will learn its group stage opponents for the opening round of competition. It's unlikely (though not impossible) that the U.S. will be the most talented team in its group, but it is hard to see them comparing unfavorably to more than one opponent. Even some European nations will look at the U.S. and be envious of our top-level talent.

And the fact that that top-level talent is so uniformly young makes things even more exciting. If you're the kind of person who likes to keep expectations low, you are free to view the entire Qatar experience as a chance for the likes of Christian Pulisic, Weston McKennie, Tyler Adams, Gio Reyna, Ricardo Pepi, and co. to get some invaluable World Cup experience ahead of the 2026 tournament, when those players will be just settling into the prime of their careers and the World Cup comes to American soil. And the best part of that situation? The U.S. is automatically qualified for 2026 by way of being a host nation, so nothing to stress about.

The 2022 FIFA World Cup Qatar begins
November 21. In the meantime, Austin FC has
a season to resume, beginning Saturday, April
2, at 6:30pm, when the Verde take on the
San Jose Earthquakes at PayPal Park.

# **The Millionaire Who Gave** It All Away in *Dear Mr. Brody*

Keith Maitland's guirky, tragic documentary about the man who thought money changed everything

Letters. So many letters. Tens of thousands of them, written on spiral note paper, on nice paper stock, on construction paper. Precisely or erratically typewritten, set down in ballpoint, felt tip, lead pencil, in flowing cursive or blocky print.

Adorned with drawings, slogans, and cartoons. Photographs and other ephemera enclosed, faces smiling and stoic, young and old. The sheer volume of letters becomes overwhelming in both power and poignancy.

It's easy to see why filmmaker Keith Maitland, following up his award-winning doc Tower, was drawn to those letters, to those stories, for his new documentary, Dear Mr. Brody. But the story of those letters begins

with the story of Michael Brody Jr., scion of a family whose fortune stems from the oleomargarine industry. Firmly rooted in Sixties counterculture, the 21-year-old millionaire announced in January of 1970 that he was giving away \$25 million to whoever wanted it. All they had to do was write to him with their requests, and he freely gave out his address and phone number.

His goal was world peace. If everyone was financially content, he reasoned, humanity could then move on to higher purposes, peace and love being chief among them. Naive, perhaps. but for almost two weeks, Brody and his newlywed wife, Renee, were hounded by crowds, the press, and hangers-on, and, briefly, Brody embraced it all. News interviews, a record deal with RCA, and an appearance on The Ed Sullivan Show; it was a whirlwind, and Maitland, having no shortage of archival material or interviews, lays it all out with that freaky flower power vibe.

Brody quickly becomes weary of it all, going from earnest to disillusioned, unable to bear the burden of his campaign. Drug use, notably a lot of PCP, and serious mental health issues eventually sent Brody to a mental ward, and he ended up taking his own life three years later, in 1973.

Contemporary interviews with Brody's widow, his then-bodyguard, and assorted satellites around the story fill in the gaps. But it is Melissa Robyn Glassman, a film producer, who becomes

> the anchor of Dear Mr. Brody. While working for Hollywood heavyweight Edward R. Pressman, Glassman discovered a dozen boxes filled with letters to Michael Brody Jr. Pressman at one time had been attached to a film

about Brody, and Glassman, rescuing the boxes from storage, became obsessed with them.

Through reenactments with actors, voiceover recitations, and, in a number of cases, tracking down the letter writers themselves, having them read and remember their lives of half a century ago. And those lives create a moving record of need spurned by grief and hope. Letters of hard times for families, of desperate fathers and idealistic children, of forlorn women and crackpots. It is nothing less than a tapestry detailing the human desire for, ves. money, but more importantly, for connection. That Maitland, Glassman, et al. have rescued these snapshots of history for us to experience feels like a fulfillment of Brody's promise.

The biggest event film out of India this year comes not from Bollywood, but from its southern cousin, the Telugu-language film industry known as Tollywood. Director S.S. Rajamouli, whose previous two-part epic Baahubali broke every Indian box-office record and managed to open in the top three in the U.S. back in April of 2017, returns after a five-year absence with the historical fiction epic RRR. Combining a duo of A-list superstars with an ambitious concept. Rajamouli turns this patriotic fantasy into an incredibly entertaining reality for fans of big action, big emotions, and big laughs.

It's 1920, the British Raj has firmly embedded itself across India, and murmurs of revolution are starting to grow among the oppressed Indian populace. Ambitious police Officer A. Rama Raju (Charan) and Gond tribal hero Komuram Bheem

(Rao) are two men on opposite sides of the law. When Bheem comes to Delhi in search of a little girl who's been kidnapped by a British general and his wife. Rama volunteers to hunt him down. Through an unlikely series of events, they wind up best friends, neither aware of the other's true identity. When the truth comes out, new conflicts arise and their relationship takes some unexpected, and often violent, turns.

RRR is the brainchild of Rajamouli and his regular screenwriter, Vijayendra Prasad. Rama and Bheem were real-life revolutionaries at the turn of the 20th century, working to confront the Raj in the same region of India. However, they never met nor worked together. RRR is a result of a thought experiment supposing that they did; what would that look like and what kind of adventures may have resulted from such a collision of larger-than-life historical figures?

In the world of Rajamouli, known for his ability to craft compelling drama incorporating truly bonkers visual creativity, this means going all out in delivering a genre-smashing action/melodrama/musical/comedy that definitely hits the spot for filmgoers seeking an escape from the mundane. Those seeking a thoughtful, nuanced exploration of Indian colonial history will find themselves smacked in the face with some of the most insane action this side of the Fast & Furious franchise, but with better dancing.

At a hair over three hours, RRR is an intimidating ask for a movie fan looking for something new, but the pacing combined with the nonstop plotting makes the time fly by. Not one to pigeonhole himself, Rajamouli works wonders with the masala formula. There is romance, there is comedy - though it is perhaps broader than a typical American audience might be accustomed to and there is action. Oh boy, is there ever action.

RRR delivers at least half a dozen insane action sequences guaranteed to show you at least one thing you've never seen before, and the film's run time is never a concern. Set-pieces include a 200-on-1 brawl, a jungle-animals-attackthe-party free-for-all, an explosive piggyback prison break, and a climactic super siege for the





ages, and that's just the beginning. Ever seen a guy punch a speeding motorcycle so hard that it flips up in the air and is then caught and used as an implement of punishment? You will.

Those unfamiliar with Indian history might find themselves lost for a moment here and there, but those instances are fleeting, as the universal language of action speaks clearly throughout *RRR*. Charan and Rao share an electric chemistry on screen, essentially rendering their actual love interests as milquetoast side pieces. If you thought Hobbs and Shaw were a cute couple, you ain't seen nothin' yet; *RRR* is bromantic action nirvana.

#### YOU WON'T BE ALONE

Goran Stolevski's dreamy debut *You Won't Be Alone* is a poetic glimpse at generational trauma. Innocent and dazed, this delicate horror film follows a feral young witch, Nevena (Klimoska), who is cursed to live under the gaze of a bitter, older one, Maria (Marinca), as she tries on the skins of different of people in a small peasant village in 19th century Macedonia. Nevena's purity gives way to a different kind of witch, one sweet and naive, with a yearning to understand life and humanity. There's a beautiful, tranquil nature to Stolevski's film, one that offers more empathy than most folk horror films of its ilk.

But patience is a virtue for You Won't Be Alone. Inspired by Terrence Malick, Stolevski uses flickering sunlight and handheld close-ups to lure his audience into the mindset of the young witch, who learns over and over again how to be a human through the bodies of many people – female, male, and child. The significance of rebirth is apparent in Nevena's journey, one her witch-mother doesn't quite grasp, and instead a lingering jealousy gnaws at Maria, who only ever desired a daughter to share her life with, no matter the cost.

The imagery of the witches and how they morph from animal to human and back to their bodies from birth is the most grotesque and unique aspect of the film. By stuffing organs into a deep gash in the left shoulder, both Nevena and Maria can transform into their most recent kill – a curse as much as it is a gift. They litter intestines across the countryside when they wish to return to their original selves, the squishing sound of body parts plopping into the dirt. However, where Maria kills with intent and malice, Nevena never kills with purpose. With her wicked nails, she often stumbles into her kills, and in return takes the deceased's body, with no malicious intent, and instead grows with her victim's body.

You Won't Be Alone is quite stunning, but Stolevski takes his time to get there, which creates a fragmented pace that is painfully slow at the front of the film. Nevena's time before she reaches the peasant village delays the heart of the film for a hair too long, is a tad too internally poetic, and straddles the line of pretentiousness. When the film shifts, it's for the better, and the latter half of the fairy tale flows gracefully along as summer eventually fades and winter's biting depression sets in.



# **A Perfect View of Prague**

Czech That Film Texas highlights Eastern European cinema at a critical moment by IKRAM MOHAMED

After a year full of uncertainties and an ever-changing situation following the pandemic, the decade-old film festival Czech That Film Texas has returned to Austin.

Texas houses the largest Czech population in the nation, and the festival organizers hope to highlight a community of which many are possibly unaware. Screening the top films from the Czech Republic within theatres around Austin. Czech That Film focuses on entertaining and educating audiences on the Czech culture as well as telling others' stories through film. With four films being screened every Tuesday throughout April, Festival Director Jeffrey Brown said there's something within this series for everyone, adding that this is a unique opportunity to be introduced to Czech cinema, not only in general but on the big screen.

Having lived in the Czech Republic for 20 years of his life. Brown said that through his work within Czech That Film Texas, he's able to extend his love for Czech films, especially now with the cloud hanging over Eastern Europe. With the anxiety and distrust present as a result of the situation. Brown said they feel as though they've chosen a fitting opening night film (Occupation) to encourage discussion concerning the topic, Czech Cultural Attaché Jan Woska will travel from the Czech Embassy in Washington, D.C., for the film's opening night screenings in Austin and San Marcos. Brown said this will allow for a unique opportunity for conversation about the current conflict, as this is likely "the only event in the coming months that's going to have a film touching on the situation with someone from one of those embassies in town.

"It's going to be something for folks to talk about and think about," Brown added. "It's going to allow the opportunity for folks to get out and have a film brought to them that's dealing with something very timely and give them a chance to talk to their peers and other moviegoers about the situation. It's going to be very good food for thought."

# **Certifiably Good**

As Ramadan approaches, a look at local halal options

When Asma Bayunus moved from a small town in Minnesota to Austin 20 years ago, there were few halal options available to her. "When I got here, I found only three halal restaurant options: Shalimar, Byblos, and Alborz," she recalls. "Those are gone now, but it seems like now there is an option for almost any craving within a 30-minute drive."

Bayunus, who grew up in the Gulf country of Oman, has always eaten exclusively halal food, which includes meat products that are regulated by a set of rules intended to ensure the health of the animal to be slaughtered and conformance to Islamic religious guidelines. This practice is also known as zabihah. "It was something that was very important to my parents. It was always the only option in our home growing up," she says. Though there are many practices she has not kept from her conservative Muslim upbringing, she has continued to uphold halal food as an important connection to her parents, which she has also passed on to her teenage son. "For me, I was fine when there were only three halal restaurants, but

when I had my son, I realized that it was also important for him to have more options. We are lucky that not only are there halal restaurants, but there are also mainstream restaurants that have halal options. The food table is a common denominator – everyone loves to eat – and when I go to places that offer options that I can eat, it feels like they built a bigger table, and I appreciate it."

While many places with limited halal offerings don't necessarily advertise that their brisket, burgers, or high-end steaks are halal, there is a loyal community who seeks out halal options and shares that information on the internet, namely via the website Zabihah.com. Founded by former Austinite Shahed Amanullah in the 1990s, Zabihah is the largest site of crowdsourced halal options around the country and the world.

The website led Bayunus to her current favorite spot, the Indo-Chinese fusion restaurant Inchin's Bamboo Garden in Round Rock. The current franchise owners are a hospitable husband-and-wife team; their chef son-in-law cooks everything fresh in the back. Bayunus' go-to choices on the Inchin's menu are the Chicken 65, chicken lettuce wraps, tandoori wings, and Mongolian beef.

Whereas Bayunus has seen a lot of growth in Austin's halal food scene across two decades. Sana Khan is a Chicago transplant who has lived here since 2019. She grew up eating halal exclusively and says, "In Chicago you could get halal high-end steaks or pretty much anything you wanted." When she moved to Austin, she went to Instagram to find halal spots to try but did not find much. Relying heavily on Zabihah. com to find what was available, she began documenting her journey exploring her way through Austin's halal offerings on her Instagram account @AustinHalalEats. She is also an admin for the Halal Food Austin group on Facebook.

What Khan appreciates the most about Austin's halal offerings is the wide variety. Whereas it is common in Chicago to have lots of options for cuisines originating in Muslim countries, Austin offers more variety with Mexican Pakistani fusion at Urban Turban, Texas-style barebecue at Alzer's

BBQ, and halal chicken and waffles at Longhorn Chicken. What she would love to find is authentic Mexican, Korean, and Hyderabadi Indian food.

In addition to patrons like Bayunus and Khan who are absolute about halal food, others like mother-of-two Nora Altiti prefer to eat halal when it's available but do not eat it exclusively. Born in Austin, Altiti spent her teenage years living in Jordan with her extended family. When Altiti wants the taste of comfort food from Jordan, she calls in an order to Usta Kababgy: "It is the flavor of family gatherings and time with my tayta [grandmother]." Located in the Lamar/

Rundberg area, known as Austin's international district, Usta Kababgy bills itself as a halal barbecue destination. Though the Arabic term for the way the food is prepared, mashawi, can be translated as barbecue, the food is cooked using a charcoal cooking method more akin to grilling.

Nora's favorites on the Usta Kababgy menu are the lahmajun (thinly rolled flatbread with a generous layer of well-seasoned ground beef), and Adana and Iraqi kababs (both made with a mix of lamb and beef). Though she generally orders her food to go, when she eats in-restaurant her meal

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


is only finished when she has had a cup of their Turkish coffee. It is a strong coffee that can be enjoyed sweet or unsweet, and with a thin layer of froth on top; the bottom of the cup has a layer of grounds that are to be left in the cup. The food is served casually on paper plates with plasticware, but the Turkish coffee is served beautifully in tiny zamak-encased cups.

Inchin's Bamboo Garden franchise owner Arfan Ahmed says he has seen a 35% increase in customers at his establishment specifying halal over the last two years, with about half requesting halal currently. "Besides religious reasons, halal meat is cleaner and healthier. We have a growing Muslim population in Austin with fewer halal options compared to big cities like Houston and Dallas, so a halal menu is important for serving the community," he says. Austin has an estimated Muslim population of greater than 30,000 people. Many of them are preparing for Ramadan (the month of daytime fasting) in April, and the holiday of Eid al-Fitr (celebration of the end of the month of fasting) in May. Ahmed says that he is expecting an increase in both

takeout and dine-in orders during this first Ramadan since Austin's COVID risk guidelines are currently low.

This Ramadan, Bayunus is expecting to patronize several of Austin's halal spots. As she reflected on the expansion of halal options today compared to when she first arrived in Austin two decades ago, she says, "I feel like there are so many excellent choices in Austin right now. I can call in an order for almost anything I want."

# **Gary Keller Now Owns West Austin's One World Theatre**

Austin music benefactor adds One World to real estate portfolio, alongside Saxon Pub

After a year of rumors regarding changes at **One World Theatre**, a new landowner has emerged. Garv Keller, co-founder of Keller Williams Realty, has purchased the West Austin venue known for renowned world. iazz, folk, and legacy music bookings. Nick Shuley, president of Keller's Austin Music Movement organization, confirmed the real estate magnate's involvement in the sale to the Chronicle last week.

Shuley said the team isn't ready to comment on specific plans for One World, but indicated its continued use as a performance venue. A major player in Austin music advocacy, Keller leads a far-reaching network of philanthropic efforts under the Austin Music Movement header, supporting over a dozen nonprofits including **HAAM**, the SIMS Foundation, and Red River Cultural District. Keller is known as a regular attendee and supporter at One World, frequently seated in the front row.

This isn't Keller's first purchase of a struggling music locale. In 2016, when songwriters' hub the Saxon Pub was slated to relocate from its original home, Keller stepped in to preserve the 1320 S. Lamar property. The billionaire funded renovations and allowed the business to continue operating indefinitely.

According to Travis County records, One World Theatre at 7701 Bee Cave Rd. was sold last September to a business entity registered to Valerie Vogler-Stipe, managing director at Keller Williams Realty International. The property was purchased from **BCAC Acquisition LLC**, registered to One World co-founder and Executive Director Hartt Stearns, which had owned the property since 2007. Stearns and wife Nada opened One World Theatre in 1999.

Stearns declined to comment on changes at the venue on a phone call in early March.

Currently shuttered, the last show to take place at One World featured Pat Metheny in February. The venue website says, "We are undergoing changes. No shows or private events are being scheduled at this time. Please check back later."

Last April, inaccurate reports floated that famed podcaster and new Austin resident Joe Rogan had purchased the West Austin music venue. (Rogan has since opted to launch his comedy club at the former Alamo **Drafthouse Ritz** location on 320 E. Sixth.) At the time, "Faster Than Sound" confirmed that no deal had been settled. Still, multiple sources said the Stearns were in talks with new investment partners following financial difficulties due to COVID-19.

The Stearns formed One World in 1993 as a vouth education program, expanding to the theatre facility in 1999. Alongside booking world-class acts like Sérgio Mendes, Herbie Hancock, and Miriam Makeba, their 501(c) (3) nonprofit structure supported various music education programs and scholarships.

The Tuscan-style building packs a juicy Austin history. The 300-seat theatre was constructed by members of spiritual cult the **Buddhafield**, under instruction of their charismatic leader, known as Michel. No longer connected to the One World in any way, the Hollywood-launched group relocated locally in the Nineties, as featured in the 2016 documentary Holy Hell.

One World last shared a January 24 website update announcing dozens of cancellations "due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic." The post also shared: "We thank you for your patience & understanding as we strive to answer everyone's questions. We are extremely grateful for your patronage & support while we work together to help ensure the future of the live music scene in a city we all love so much."

#### **COVID Concern Post-SXSW**

Everyone in music circles seems to know a handful of people who caught COVID during the festivities of SXSW. As we've dealt with while reporting on live music and the virus for the past few years, it's difficult to nail down exactly where someone got sick while enjoying the joyful return of megafest events official and unofficial - and all the house shows and traveling and out-of-towner-incorporating hangouts that happen in between. While a few people requested reporting on this, surprisingly including the writer **Damon Krukowski** of **Galaxie 500.** few bands expressed interest in confirming viral status for print, understandably.

Safe to say, the cases among musicians were enough to inspire conversations about the potential for COVID to interrupt the national tours artists have waited so long to reschedule and reschedule again. California's Sasami, who led five raging Festival sets under her current metal concept, posted soon after: "I fucking BEG YOU to please wear your masks at my shows. I am not a big band, if we get Covid and have to cancel shows I'm fully FUCKED if u love me at all please wear a mask and buy merch so we can keep touring squeeze," referencing her fantastic new LP.

Toronto-based Charlotte Cornfield, whose restless storytelling I enjoyed mid-Fest at the Ballroom, updated on Twitter last week: "Yes sxsw was a superspreader event and yes my entire band got covid, as did many others. We obviously knew there was a risk going in but really feeling for everyone whose tours/lives have been derailed by this thing."

#### **Waterloo Records Celebrates 40th Birthday With Two In-Store Performances**

The return of **South by Southwest** wasn't quite complete without **Waterloo** Records' much-loved parking lot parties. The no-badge, all-ages lineups provided an accessible entry point during my own early voyages to the Festival as a San Antonio high schooler. Throughout the pandemic, Waterloo owner John **Kunz** has played it safe – inching from curbside to appointment shopping to reopening with book and record signings last year.

Finally, on the occasion of the legendary vinyl (and more) emporium's 40th birthday, Waterloo reintroduces live music for the first time in over two years. No joke, the shop opened April 1, 1982. To celebrate, Waterloo hosts two in-store performances by Ray Wylie Hubbard (3pm) and Heartless Bastards (5pm) this Friday, April 1.

"We used to have in-stores a couple of times a week and average 75 to 100 a year," says Kunz. "I always say, 'It's artists from around the corner to around the world.' It's a huge part of us being a cog in the local music community."

Masks are required at the limited-capacity performances on the store's indoor stage. Fans can receive one guaranteed-admission wristband for Hubbard's performance with the purchase of an LP or CD of the Texas songwriter's new album. Co-Starring Too. For Heartless Bastard's separate-entry set, the same rules apply with purchase of the band's 2021 album. A Beautiful Life.

Say you already bought one of the above? Just bring your receipt or record as proof to grab a wristband at the store. After priority wristband entry, others will be admitted as capacity allows. Austin's largest and oldest music retailer also offers "40 staff-selected top LPs on sale for \$4 or more off," today through Wed., April 6.

Over four decades, Kunz's kingdom has shifted through cassette signings, the dawn of CDs, the dwindling of record pressings, and our current vinyl revival. From their original location to Waterloo's current corner hub since 1989, the store has hosted performances by the likes of Willie Nelson, Jimmy Cliff, Gary Clark Jr., St. Vincent, and so many more. 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
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# **Heavy Lifting: The Hammond Organ Has** a Special Place in Austin ... I Should Know

Austin's an epicenter for an instrument that stopped being manufactured 47 years ago by RED YOUNG

The Hammond organ - it's heavy, it's hard to move, you basically become a lifelong van owner if you play one, and I've often said, "If your back doesn't hurt - it doesn't sound right.'

But I have to admit it, I love the Hammond: the sound, the versatility, the power, the dynamics. I've been inspired by the players that have played and still play it. Each person that sits down and plays has their own sound and ideas - so much so that the organ takes on their personality. Even though it's the same instrument, to the listener it sounds like a different instrument with each artist.

I first heard it in the Sixties on songs like "Green Onions," "Gimme Some Lovin'," "House of the Rising Sun," and "Oye Como Va" and was inspired by its use through artists like the Allman Brothers, Deep Purple, Pink Floyd, and Jimmy Smith. Eighteen years old and sneaking into clubs in Ft. Worth, I couldn't afford an organ at the time, but knew one day I wanted to have one. In my late teens I moved to Springfield, Mass., and there were several clubs that had Hammond organs and also players who knew how to play them - so I watched and learned. It's not an instrument you learn from books or YouTube, but by watching someone make different combinations of the drawbars – using the two manuals and foot pedals - and then you develop your own playing style, adding your own ideas and sounds to make it the way you hear it in your head. Uniquely, the Hammond organ can blend in with any style of music being played and any size band. Piano, guitar, and saxophone all have their own sound, but the Hammond can be mellow, aggressive, sweet, or full. It can surround a vocalist or be a lead instrument or do the work of a full big band or orchestra, depending on how well you can play it.

The original organ was made by hand and the machines that made the tone wheels and other equipment since 1935 were destroyed in a fire in 1975. During that time, though, more than 2 million were made and many are still in use today. There were different models and the electronics changed over the years, but the tonewheel engine was the same in all models, including the A-100, the C-3, the D-100, and of course, the definitive concert model: the B-3.



I bought my first Hammond organ at age 23, in 1971, after playing the clubs in Springfield, and then bought a van and drove it around New England for the next three years, playing gigs. In 1974 I joined a band in Houston backing up legendary Fifties singer Lloyd Price, then came back to Ft. Worth and played solo at the London House restaurant on piano and organ and at the HOP near Texas Christian University with the Ham Brothers band. Over the next three years I did countless recording sessions and concerts and then, in 1976, I joined Sonny & Cher thanks to guitarist Bill Ham. After that I toured with British vocalist Joan Armatrading and

then moved to Los Angeles taking my organ on the road for the next three years.

In the Eighties, I retired my Hammond from the road and kept it in recording studios. In 1984, after tours with Eric Burdon and Linda Ronstadt, I moved back to Ft. Worth. That

marked the beginning of Red & the Red Hots, my first turn as a marquee bandleader. We recorded an album and I moved back to L.A. for the next 14 years, having success in performances, TV, movies, and in concert. During that time, I'd rent my organ to recording sessions - moving the 400-pound instrument and its accompanying 130-pound Leslie speaker by myself. Eventually, in 1998, I started playing it live again in L.A. clubs.

By that time, I'd been on a four-decade journey with the Hammond organ, through

changing sounds - like the emergence of synthesizers, drum machines, and sampled music in the Eighties - and it going in and out of vogue. All those years later, I still loved the sound – especially live. Music has a way of coming around full circle.

In 2000 I wanted to play more Hammond. but there were few places to do that in L.A., so with the help of some friends. I did a little tour of Texas with my organ trio, playing nine gigs over 10 days, and found the audience receptive – especially in Austin at the Continental Club. Looking around Austin, I found Antone's had a Hammond organ, but if you wanted to play one outside of there, you had to bring your own. Around that time I met Mike Flanigin as he sat in on a gig I did at Speakeasy. You could say the desire to play the Hammond organ brought me to Austin because there was the opportunity to play and lots of clubs to play in - plus several club owners who were supportive of it.

After I moved and began playing my organ weekly with a trio that included Ephraim Owens and Brannen Temple, I saw quite a few places that would be suitable for Hammond, plus a very active music scene and live audience support. Flanigin had spent time in Boston where there were many knowledgeable organ players who coached him and there were instruments to play in the area, similar to how I learned in Western Massachusetts.

To learn, you really need three ingredients: the organ, the players, and the clubs. In Texas there wasn't a scene like that ... yet.



I knew Ian McLagan, who'd played in Faces and with the Rolling Stones, lived in Austin, as did Gregg Rolie, who'd sung and played organ in Santana and Journey, plus Riley Osbourn, Nick Connolly, and

Mel Brown, but I was excited when Dr. James Polk came into Ludwig's Bar on Fourth Street and listened to me play. I knew he played organ with Ray Charles and at Jimmy Smith's club in L.A. After a few weeks of coaxing, he came up and sat in with me - finally!

Along with Ludwig's, I also started playing at the Elephant Room, while Flanigin would play the B-3 at a Sixth Street club called Jazz, A Louisiana Kitchen. During that time I'd drive to Dallas weekly to play clubs there and was a partner of one called Diango on the Parkway. I also rejoined Eric Burdon, touring with his band

In 2007, Ephraim, Brannen, and I started a weekly gig at Lamberts and called it Black Red Black. Once, I got stuck in the historic building's tiny elevator while moving the

organ up to the second floor, and sometimes, after leaving my instrument behind the stage, aromas from Lamberts' kitchen would stick to my Hammond. I'd be driving in my van to a gig and get a whiff of barbecue. Black Red Black recorded our first album upstairs there, with Shelley Carrol on sax and Gary Clark Jr. on guitar, ultimately winning Best Jazz Band in the Austin Music Awards.

In the meantime, Flanigin moved his organ up to a new venue Steve Wertheimer owned that he wanted to use as an overflow and waiting room for his shows at the Continental Club. Barry "Frosty" Smith an incredible drummer who'd played in the Sixties with organist/singer Lee Michaels - joined him on drums Thursday through Saturday. It took awhile to get the room, eventually known as the Gallery, going, as it wasn't advertised, but it became a hot spot for eclectic jazz and generally creative music. Ephraim Owens started playing on Tuesdays and Brannen and I joined Ephraim, with me playing on Flanigin's organ. I moved my Hammond to the Elephant Room and did monthly shows there with two horns. Meanwhile, the Brass House on San Jacinto added to Austin's Hammond organ arsenal, and south side listening room Strange Brew had an A-100 that many played as well. Black Red Black took up residence at the Highball on South Lamar and, when it got torn down, we moved across the street to One-2-One Bar for a few years, while also playing with the Ephraim Owens Experience at the Gallery.

Little by little, a Hammond organ scene in Austin was growing – which only attracted more players.

Flanigin continued at the Gallery and added Jimmie Vaughan or Johnny Moeller on guitar, while on Wednesday nights Anthony Farrell from the Greyhounds moved in, Ephraim continued on Tuesday, and Elias Haslanger with Dr. James Polk on organ recorded and started playing under the banner Church on Monday.

Wertheimer then acquired Trophy's on South Congress and turned it into C-Boy's, and Flanigin and Vaughan moved there with yet another Hammond. Then Steve acquired another Hammond for downstairs at the Continental Club, which is in use as well.

"The Hammond upstairs in the Gallery probably gets played four to five times a week out of the six nights we're open," Wertheimer said in a recent discussion about organs in Austin. "The one at C-Boy's gets played at least three or four times a week. For a while I thought it was a dying art, but now that we've provided that instrument, it seems like there's more and more great keyboard players out there interested in playing it. There may be a lot of people who didn't know they wanted to be organ players, then they sat down on the bench and tried it out and loved the sound, which I do too - that's why I have them. They're a pain in the ass to maintain, they're a pain in the ass to move around, they're expensive, and there's nothing else that sounds like them."

After C-Boy's came into the organ landscape, some of the Gallery residents moved over to the sister business, opening spots for other acts like the Lost Counts, with Nate Basinger on Hammond, playing Friday and Saturday at the Gallery. The scene continued to grow.

When the legendary blues club Antone's, no stranger to having a house organ in its 45-plus-year history, reopened on Fifth Street in 2016, I furnished it with an organ—my fourth Hammond, which I was gifted by someone who wanted to learn it but never got around to it. Austin's organ atmosphere



continued to develop in 2018 when Parker Jazz Club opened in the Warehouse District and owner/jazz musician Kris Kimura bought the Brass House's old Hammond.

So at this point, Austin has seven venues – Antone's, C-Boy's, Continental Club, Elephant Room (I move my XK-5 when I play there), the Gallery, Parker Jazz Club, and Sam's Town Point – where Hammonds live onstage, and shows every night of the week where you can hear someone playing one.

How many cities can you say that about? I've been around the country – and the world – in all my travels and never seen another. People are astounded, rightly, by how many organs in residence we have.



I moved my personal Hammond B-3, the one I'd bought in 1971, to the Gallery last October. I wanted to have a great instrument for myself and Dr. James Polk to play and also have younger musicians come in and see what this is all about.

It's wonderful to see an instrument I have such passion for being used every night of the week. In a conversation with Mike Flanigin, we both compared notes on how we learned and found it's a communal thing. We learn by watching and listening to each other, being inspired by the audience and other musicians, and having the encouragement to laugh and have fun while we're playing it.

There's no other instrument that's as complete as the Hammond – it involves every limb of your body: You play bass with your feet or your hands, you use both hands and change sounds while you play. You can make it talk and do anything you can conceive in your head. On my Wednesday nights at the Gallery, it's the Brannen & Red Show,

playing everything Jimmy Smith, Sly Stone, Weather Report, Count Basie, or Quincy Jones did with a full band or orchestra. On Monday at "Church," it's Elias and Dr. Polk going back to the Fifties and Sixties with sax, Hammond, guitar, bass, and drums. Later on Mondays, it's the Michael Hale Organ Trio with Jonathan Deas of Gary Clark Jr.'s band on Hammond and many younger keyboard players, plus myself, sitting in.

Sean Giddings of the Ephraim Owens Experience holds down the Gallery on Tuesdays, while Josh Perdue plays on Friday and Saturday with Sam Witt. Downstairs, at the Continental, it's the Blues Specialists, the Peterson Brothers, and others with the Hammond organ in use as well. C-Boy's has Mike and Jimmie on Friday and Saturday, but many other weekly shows with Hammond. Parker has had touring acts like Philadelphia's Joey DeFrancesco. Antone's has many organ groups and we've had organ summits there, plus bookings of everyone from Booker T. to Ike Stubblefield, Dr. Lonnie Smith, Neal Francis, and Leon Roberts.

For an instrument that stopped being built 47 years ago, the Hammond organ sounds as good and unique as it did when I first bought mine in 1971. And the ones that are learning now will be carrying on this tradition because we have created a great, creative spot on the planet where you can hear and see this incredible instrument. I'm proud to have been a part of the process of honoring and moving music forward, but also looking back here in Austin and in the world.

Red Young is an Austin-based organist and pianist who has performed alongside artists including Dolly Parton, Willie Nelson, Eric Burdon, Linda Ronstadt, Tanya Tucker, and Sonny & Cher in addition to fronting his own projects, including Red & the Red Hots.

#### **FENNEC**

#### a couple of good days

Mass Appeal – the New York City-based media company known as a creative and investment vehicle for the rapper Nas - used to have a popular YouTube series called Rhythm Roulette. It was a show where notable producers would hit a local record store, put on a blindfold to pick out three random records, and then attempt to make music out of samples found. Some of

the shows produced were "better" than others, but everything was incredibly interesting. This is also the story of Fennec's a couple of good days, a sometimes strange, unwieldy, yet fulfilling and poetic record that remains intriguing. The Austin producer assembles sounds of a weekend gone too fast, soon to be usurped by Slack notifications and unnecessary emails. Much of the project recalls what the title implies; a dope weekend, maybe around a pool during a staycation. He also gets a little loose with samples throughout, like the vocals in "aperol spritz," one of many house/ lounge/poolside-inspired tracks. The album's more unusual offering, "russian dressing," appears to have been made out of something from the exotica section, where only genuinely insane people run a proper dig for records. Summery, trap-lite "honda with my bb" conveys dusk drives of a broke player with his lady, with drive-through Sonic slushes in a convertible where the top's broken and only goes down 75% of the way – but everything is good. Y'know?

#### The Lost Well: Rock for Rent Vol. 1

Is there any image more representative of underground rock & roll than a grimy steel urinal, plastered with dozens of punk and metal band stickers? The Lost Well's Tetris-piece piss trough, brimming with a fresh load of glistening ice cubes, opens as the gatefold photo supreme gracing the deafening dive's new vinyl comp. While the stickers themselves could serve as a solid primer on the venue's resident scene - or at lease those daring enough to touch an extremely unsanitary surface for self-promotion - I'd recommend buying this silver vinyl, available at the bar, instead.

J Bybee's guitar, a squiggling, swooping, symphony of sonic space debris, serves as the nine-track compilation's opening ceremony before Sabbath Crow's tombstone-tumbling rhythms fortify for the barking "Bug Out." Later, Gary Chester's too-apathetic-to-sing nihilism counterintuitively conjures inspiration on heavy noise trio We Are the Astroid's lurching "Nothing." These impressively recorded live takes were captured by John Petri, who did yeoman's work hosting 35 livestreams over seven months to help fundraise toward the Lost Well's pandemic rent. Petri also holds throne in crusty D-beat/death metal crew Ungreived, who assail an oppressive nation with highlight cut "United States of Dysphoria," directly preceeding some honky-tonk blasphemy - the Beaumont's "Burn 'em Down" - and the campy, sci-fi, groovepunk climax "Scaly Face Eater" from All Monsters Attack, A live time capsule of punk, metal, hardcore, grind, country, and rock in a pandemic.

#### STEPHEN DOSTER

#### Over the Red Sea (Faw Recording)

Stephen Doster may be more familiar behind the scenes as a songwriter, producer, and guitarist, but Over the Red Sea marks his third album in the past eight years. Like 2013's Arizona and 2017's New Black Suit, Doster's latest rings reflective reckoning with recent losses and forcefully finding grace in quiet moments. As the opening salvo of "When I Cross the Divide" sets up, the songs serve as a bridge between worlds – spiritual and physical, hopeful idealism and stark reality - and Doster deftly navigates back and forth between them. Small details expand into an embrace of the moment, from the scene-setting vignettes of "The Singing Bus Driver" and "Blue Heron" to the meditative reminders of "The Sweet Life" and "We'll Still Have Today." It's keeping that focus on what matters amid the intruding dire dramas that constantly returns Doster to the song, powerfully refusing to turn away on the Heather Hyer ode "A Better World" or the immigrant strife of "Magdalena Spoke." Doster distills intense meaning in the subtlest of moments, always presenting the choice before us of how we will live facing that great divide. As he beautifully pulls back from the bad news on the phone in "Anything Could Happen:" "Time is in motion, it never stands still/ Anything could happen and it probably will."

#### **FAT GATOR MUSIC FEST**

#### Texas Ski Ranch, Saturday 2

Austin meets the Big Easy (in New Braunfels) at this all-day fest from rapper Nook Turner's activist/music promotions outfit Jump on It that looks to play on the connection between Central Texas and New Orleans that developed in the wake of Hurricane Katrina, with considerable pockets of transplants settling in the area. Fredo Bang takes the headliner spot from cousin Boosie Badazz, who was slated as the top act for the fest's original spring 2020 lineup that fell victim to the pandemic. More Louisiana flavor comes from early 2000s crunk heroes Ying Yang Twins. "By far, this is the biggest event we've done in over a decade." Turner said, explaining that attention-grabbing promotions with national headliners are intended to pay the bills and fund Jump on It's community activism projects.

#### PROGGER

#### Half Step, Thursday 31

Following a return to action playing music from the video game Super Metroid, Progger reactivates for real with this gig at Half Step. Like their fellow Texas iconoclasts Snarky Puppy, with whom they've shared personnel, Progger's more a collective than a band, but still hums to the tunes of local saxophone monster Brian Donohoe and guitarist Matt Muehling. With the band having not released an album since 2018. expect both new tunes and vintage blowouts, all played with a level of musicianship higher than the tip of the Frost Bank Tower. Best of all, it's free. - Michael Toland

#### BON IVFR

#### Moody Amphitheater, Friday 1

With no new album being pumped at press time, there's tantalizing uncertainty surrounding the rustic art-pop collective as they prepare for this weekend - only the second stop of a globe-encircling 2022. Considering our tentatively postpandemic mindset, I'd prepare for a set list stressing the spiritual continuity between the group's two most expansively communal albums - 2019's I, I and 2011's recently reissued self-titled LP plus a minimum of isolated cabin balladry. The trio's as pedigreed as they come, consisting of members from seminal Dallas grindcore kings Kill the Client, local heavy-hitters Dining With Dogs, and Lubbock legends the Dead See. Their unpredictable heavy metal, using psychedelic soundscapes and unconventional sounds like horns and live vocal effects, will leave your mind altered. Adding to the psychoactive sounds, experimental noise-doom duo Deep Cross supports, with newer outfit Phase - Robert Penson IV opening up.

#### **VIVA LOS MOTOS 2.0 WITH RED FANG** AND MUNICIPAL WASTE

#### Austin Motocross Park, Saturday 2

Picture a scene straight out of 1971's postapocalyptic mash note The Omega Man: After 16 months of raging global pandemic, a bedraggled cluster of survivors living amongst the ruins of a major urban center converge on an OG motocross site out beyond the airport. Before you can say, "Don't you mean Mad Max?" hundreds of rabid Neanderthals erupt into a man pit under an enormous. Euro-style festival tent as the track roars to life with riders launching two stories in the air while High on Fire spits flames and everyone loses what's left of their ever-loving minds. Now ongoing thanks to backliners Boss Radio Music Services, a hometown crew manned by drummer Buddy Hachar of medieval ATX metalists Greenbeard, last June's spectacle returns with DJs, vendors, and never-ending moto launches. Oregonian quick-sludge cryptids Red Fang headline behind fifth disc Arrows, as nervy and distressed as any George Miller film, with spigots manned by Virginian beer thrashers Municipal Waste, and supported by local speed hammerheads American Sharks and Austin legacy punks Pocket Fishrmen. Support comes with neo-soul outfit BluMoon and poet Chucky Blk. Butterscotch-sweet timbres and watercolor jazz swirl in the former's 2019 LP, Slow Burn. My girlfriend said, "You have ghosts!" and I said, "It's probably a rat," because my cat has killed at least one rat in my house already, but she insisted I have a ghost and said we had to go to her house to spend the night. We argued about that for 30 minutes and then she got mad and left to go back to her apartment. I don't know if she was being serious about the ghost, but either way I wasn't going to give in because if I did we would end up sleeping at her place every night and she has a really small condo Downtown. So what do I do? Admit I have a ghost in my house to make peace, or hold my ground and hope she comes around? - Doesn't Believe in Ghosts

Look, I will be the first to admit that Gadsby is a bit of a slow burn, and mental illness, family dysfunction, and autism don't always yield the treasure trove of comedy we expect them to, but make no mistake, she's funny. She may not be funny to you, though, and that's perfectly OK. Jay Leno hosted The Tonight Show for 17 years. Seventeen years. The only way that seems even remotely possible is if Jay Leno somehow has a graphic porn video involving a roomful of naked, Vaseline-lubed NBC executives squirreled away in some safe deposit box in the Caymans. If that really is the case, you sort of have to admire his opportunistic pluck, right? I'm not sure Gadsby wants it that bad, and that's part of her charm. She does a really good job at selling that IDGAF vibe. Leno, on the other hand, oozes desperation from his pores. I bet his entire classic car collection smells like flop sweat. It's too bad Jeffrey Epstein never thought of getting his own late-night talk show. That might have been a game-changer. 



#### THOMAS GROUNDS **THORNHILL** 1948-2022
