What to Expect When You're Expecting a Disaster

In this week's cover story, Lina Fisher tackles two very serious threats keeping local emergency planners up at night: wildfire and flood. I asked Lina, a native Austinite who writes frequently about environmental and development issues, about her experience reporting this story.

"I was struck by the omnipresence of the risk, due to climate WEHAVE change and the way the city has been built. It intersects so much **AN ISSUE** with land development code." BY KIMBERLEY Lina pointed out that, though JONES code has been written to steer future construction, "a lot of these problems were created in the Eighties," mentioning subdivisions built without evacuation routes in mind, or buildings constructed with flammable materials.

Lina told me the flood component of the story required less work to report - Austin has more experience with flooding, which also means "we have a more robust system in place for that" - but the fire reporting was more labor-intensive, and that her findings there were more dismaying.

Her biggest takeaway? "It's more about preparation than actual response." She encouraged readers to take a look at the city of Austin's "What's My Wildfire Risk?" map (find that interactive map with her story online at austinchronicle.com/news) and consider ways you can make your home and

community safer, including becoming a Firewise neighborhood.

A different kind of disaster, an unnatural one, took place Tuesday in Uvalde, Texas, when 19 children lost their lives after a gunman opened fire in their elementary school. There is a poison

here. How any sane person could look at this state and this country's epidemic of mass shootings and think the answer is to further loosen gun control laws is beyond me. My heart goes out to the community of Uvalde, and to every parent who knows not even a school or a place of worship can offer safe harbor for their child so long as the gun lobby is steering the moral compass of our elected leaders.





Neither Slumber Nor Sleep

We will be othered, threatened, vilified, even fired upon. We must not let it stop us.

In the 1941 Berlin telephone directory, my grandfather, a doctor, is listed with a Star of David next to his name. (He was also required to list his middle name as "Israel"; for women, it was "Sarah.") His own father, also a doctor, is no **AUSTIN** longer listed, because he was **AT LARGE** already in Nazi custody; he would die later that year in BY MIKE CLARK-Minsk. But his mother had been MADISON born a gentile – her maiden name was in fact Braun - and so under the Nuremberg Laws my grandfather was a "Mischling" - which is as insulting as it sounds ("mongrel") - and thus not yet cast out of the quickly deteriorating

German state. His mother had converted.

kept kosher, and aligned herself as much as possible with the Jewish community in Berlin, which was not very Orthodox at all and generally thought of itself as

German first. But none of this mattered, as Hitler insisted Jews must be a race unto themselves.

My grandfather survived a different set of Nazi depredations – being arrested and sent to the Russian front, where doctors were badly needed – but survived until after the war, when the

Russians abducted all the doctors in EastBerlin, brought them to Sachsenhausen (the nearest concentration camp, which they'd repurposed into their own prison),

and told them to stem a raging cholera epidemic. They failed, and he died, and after that my family was Jewish no longer. There are only three of us left; I will allude in passing to being of Jewish heritage but mostly leave this story unsaid, because while many find it interesting, others have found it threatening or offensive. Some of those may be reading it now; some of those people could be Nazis themselves, if they had a mind to.

21 DEAD IN UVALDE A gunman armed with an automatic rifle killed at least 19 children and two teachers at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde on Tuesday.

THE SHOW MUST GO ON Donald Trump is set to headline the National Rifle Association convention in Houston this Friday. The NRA announced that he will be joined "in a celebration of Second Amendment rights" by Gov. Greg Abbott, Sen. John Cornyn, Sen. Ted Cruz, though Cornyn has since dropped out.

SCHOOL BOARD BOILING POINT The Texas Association of School Boards severed its ties with the National School Boards Association this week, following the discovery that the NSBA had been planning to ask the White House to send soldiers to school board meetings to protect board members. That request never happened, but a September letter from NSBA did ask Biden officials to investigate threats against trustees as terrorism, drawing instant Republican backlash.


CHURCH COVER-UP A highly anticipated investigative report released on Sunday showed that leaders of the Southern Baptist Convention for two decades hid allegations of sexual abuse rather than reporting accusations to authorities or firing those responsible. The report pointed to Prestonwood Baptist in Plano (Ken Paxton and Jeff Leach's church) and its pastor, Jack Graham, as an example.

SAFER SIXTH: CHOOSE YOUR FIGHTER A memo released last week by police Chief Joe Chacon and Development Services Director Denise Lucas laid out two options to improve safety on Sixth Street: a \$898,187 plan that would replace all existing cameras in the district and add new cameras, and a \$193,000 plan that would just add cameras.

HOUSING IS VITAL Local nonprofit **Project Transitions** announced a \$3.5 million campaign Wednesday to develop 101 housing units exclusively for people with HIV. The **HIV: Housing Is Vital** campaign will supplement more than \$25 million in public funding to construct the projects.

RESULTS ARE IN After election day Tuesday, races to watch include Georgia governor, which sees the Democratic star Stacey Abrams against incumbent Gov. Brian Kemp. In Arkansas, Sen. John Boozman faces Democrat Natalle James, after Boozman made enemies in the Trump base by refusing to help overturn the 2020 election. In Alabama's Senate race, Democrat Will Boyd will almost certainly face Katle Britt, who nearly won outright but faces a run-off with U.S. Rep. Mo Brooks, who was un-endorsed by private citizen Donald Trump.

bullshit that is just as cracked and as repulsive and yet as insidious as the Nuremberg Laws. Remember, Hitler genuinely believed this stuff; he was also convinced that all-powerful Jews controlled the United States and was shocked that America entered the war, even after Pearl Harbor. We know beyond a doubt that the Buffalo shooter's "doctrine" - and the corollary doctrine that all Americans, but really just themselves, should be armed and dangerous – is at the same time totally unacceptable to believe and act upon in a civilized society, and championed by a major U.S. political party and its reactionary media propaganda machine. All that varies is how far members of Fox News Nation, with what power they have, are willing to go to act upon what they believe. If they genuinely don't believe it, and are just riding the train to get to political power faster, then they are running out of time to jump off before it derails.

People think I'm too hopeful about the darkness that lies before us, that it's just not possible any more to see a way out back into the light. One reason for that is that I also try to act on my beliefs, which include the existence of a loving and providential God, which means hope is not optional. But on the secular level of the news of the week, rather than saying I have hope, I more want you to know that I see opportunity. That is because while the people lined up on the wrong side of history, of justice, and of truth may project fearsome power, they are in reality very weak, stupid, corrupt, decadent, and soft. That is why they want to rig the rules to keep themselves in power and to take power away from you.

It vexes me more every day when I hear the Democratic message machine - which is so much less effective than its fascist counterpart even though we control the White House and Congress - make noises about These are called Stolpersteine – "stumbling blocks" - little brass plaques in the street that serve as everyday memorials at addresses in Berlin and all over Europe where victims of Nazism lived. This one is for my great-grandfather.

"authoritarianism" or even "protecting our democracy." This is not a political science class; our lives are at stake, quite literally. This is about the fascists trying to steal what is rightfully yours, take power they did not earn, control your bodies and punish your minds, all because they truly believe what they see on TV and read on their socials, which is the only engagement they have with life beyond themselves, and which is designed to anger and frighten them about your very existence. But they are still lame, stupid, and weak. There is a limit to the damage they can do unless we let them run riot unopposed.

We shouldn't do that.

UP GOES THE BETO-SIGNAL

For the most junior and thus weakest members of the fascist class - the 18- and 20-year-old perps of so many massacres the only way to redeem their internetpoisoned, racist, incel lives is with an AR-15. We don't know much about the Uvalde shooter, but we do know he creeped young women out on Instagram and made no secret of his gun lust. He may not have regurgitated a manifesto of 4chan memes and Tucker Carlson scripts before he turned an elementary school into a killing field worthy of Sachsenhausen. But we know he should have been watched more closely and not trusted with deadly force.

The headline for this column is from Psalm 121:4 & 6-7: "Behold, he who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep ... / The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night/ The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life." In my faith, that loving and providential God is in all things and thus all of us, and so we have strength to neither slumber nor sleep ourselves to keep each other from all evil. Irish Catholic Beto O'Rourke believes similar things about God, though not his church, and his bearing witness in the faces of Greg Abbott and Dan Patrick in Uvalde on Wednesday is both the politically smart and the morally appropriate thing to do. Notice how the folks on the other side, who think they speak for all Christians and have a monopoly on God's love, screamed and shrieked like little Satan-spawned kittens when O'Rourke actually showed up and called them out on their shit. If he and we all keep doing that from now until November, our future will be less bleak.

ELIZALDE BAILS OUT OF AISD, TO REJOICING AND ANXIETY

After months of brushing off rumors that she would give up the reins of Austin ISD, Superintendent Stephanie Elizalde was last week named sole finalist for the top job in Dallas ISD, where she was chief schools officer before coming to Austin in 2020.

On April 7, the district said in its weekly email to staff that "Dr. Elizalde is here to stay." That announcement was prompted by rumors that she had made the Dallas short list; school districts are allowed to keep much of their executive hiring process confidential. Trustees in DISD must wait 21 days before officially hiring Elizalde, which is usually a formality.

As the news sinks in, families, educators, and other AISD stakeholders are trying to decide what it means for the beleaguered district. Elizalde joined AISD amid the arduous first months of the COVID-19 pandemic, when schools were trying to ramp up their first full semester of remote learning. During her less than two years at the helm. Austin schools have faced a difficult transition to hybrid learning, struggled to reduce the spread of COVID on campus, and are now coping with a tsunami of teacher resignations - all while feeling the fiscal pressure squeezing AISD as its enrollment declines while its tax roll grows. meaning ever-larger recapture payments to the state - though Elizalde's critics say she's partly to blame for the district's current budget shortfall.

With the news of Elizalde's departure, teachers appeared to collectively rejoice. Ken Zarifis, the president of the Education Austin employee union,

described the situation as a "win-win." "She got a job she wanted, and I think we're going to be able to move forward with the employees in a different fashion."

Dalton Pool, a teacher and coach at Bowie High, said the district is better off with her departure. "We understand the state, and specifically recapture, make it almost impossible to get the pay and resources we deserve, but incompetence, mistrust, and poor decision-making get in the way of us doing what we do best," Pool told the Chronicle. "That was the breaking point for so many of my colleagues that have decided not to return."

Some parents approached the situation with warier eyes. Cuitlahuac Guerra-Mojarro, a parent with children in AISD schools, said he's worried the district will once again rush to find a new leader, as it did after Elizalde's predecessor Paul Cruz abruptly resigned in February 2020. Guerra-Mojarro, who organized against the closure of historically Black and Latino cam**puses** that the AISD Board of Trustees approved in late 2019, said that Elizalde. like Cruz, will not see through what she started - in her case, adjusting the district's staffing structure and facing down the budget crisis she long promised to

Guerra-Mojarro worries that choosing a new superintendent shortly before the November board elections could leave AISD with new trustees at odds with leadership. "We should hire an interim [superintendent] to get us past November," he suggested. "What's really most important to me is not repeating the mistakes of the past and making sure that community input is authentic, and that the school board selects a person to do positive things for our students."

Candace Hunter, who has a seventh-grader in the district, said she views Elizalde's imminent departure as an opportunity to find a better fit for a district that's never quite meshed with her style. Nevertheless, she said she's disappointed that Elizalde is leaving, for the same reasons as Guerra-Mojarro.

Board President **Geronimo Rodriguez** said trustees will meet soon to discuss a transition plan for administrative leadership. "Thank you to Dr. Elizalde for her steadfast leadership through what has been an unprecedented and challenging two years," he said in a statement. "Her commitment to our AISD mission allowed our community to safely move through the pandemic and stay laser-focused on academic achievement." - Morgan O'Hanlon

What really makes a difference in housing production

There's an excellent article on the *Chronicle* website as we go to press that didn't make it into the print edition because of physics – that is, a combination of time and space:

Austin Sanders profiling the eight new affordable housing developments that Foundation Communities is in the

process of opening over the next few years. It's a great organization, and a great read, but in terms of public policy, what I found interesting were a couple of things that FC Director **Walter Moreau** said, and didn't say, in describing the difficulties they face in the development process.

There's **financing**, of course, and **construction costs**, which have gone up 30% in the last two years, but among things local officials have some control over, it's **the city's permitting process** that comes to mind. And indeed, though it's never really caught the public's attention, people have been pointing a finger at **Permitting and Development review** for close to a decade

now ("Public Notice: Nervous Times for the City's Planning and Development Review Department," Feb. 27, 2015).

What Moreau doesn't mention is **zoning** conflicts, or **compatibility** limitations, or neighborhood opposition, or any of those

sorts of hot-button issues that have very much caught the public's imagination as things they *believe* will make a difference.

Like I said, interesting.

The Field Is Set

Few surprises as Texas finally finishes its primaries

In Texas, you can't vote in the **primary** run-off if you didn't vote in the first round. About one in three of those who voted in March chose to show up nearly three months later - and three weeks after voting in a totally different election – to finally set the state ballot for November. Statewide, that translated to just under 1 mil-

lion on the GOP side and just under half a million on the Dem side, out of Texas' roughly 17 million registered voters.

The marquee event, of course, was the GOP smackdown between Ken Paxton and George P. Bush - perhaps the two most incompetent statewide electeds - for Paxton's attorney general post. The outcome here was never in doubt come election night, with K-Pax, whose closing argument was, "Help me put an end to the Bush dynasty," winning 2-to-1 against the incumbent land commissioner, whose wreckage of that office has alienated Republicans (the Alamo) and Democrats (Harvey relief) alike. The Bush clan is 0-3 in its last races – P's dad Jeb! in 2016, his cousin Pierce in a 2020 U.S. House race in Houston, and now this. iHasta luego! Their only bright spot is that P. won Travis County by about 1,800 votes.

Maybe he'll move here, switch parties, and run against Lloyd Doggett.


On the Dem side in the same race, Rochelle Garza finished what she started in March, defeating Joe Jaworski by a margin similar to Paxton's. Much closer, unaccountably, were the statewide run-offs for lieu-

> > Mike Collier and Jay Kleberg finished 10 and 5 points ahead of outgoing state Rep. Michelle Beckley of Carrollton and random candidate Sandragrace Martinez of San Antonio. respectively.

At least Beckley, who likewise finished 10 points back of Collier in the first round, is an elected official, though


by most reports a bad one. Martinez, a therapist with no discernible background or interest in issues faced by the General Land Office (maybe the Alamo?), came in first in March ahead of Kleberg, a longtime leader in land conservation and a scion of the family that owns the legendary King Ranch. That's a pretty damning testament to the failure of Texas Democrats to inform their electorate. According to Mark P. Jones, fellow in political science at Rice University's Baker Institute for Public Policy, Martinez



likely was able to make it this far because Texas Democrats favor female and Latinx names on a ballot, particularly when they don't know much about the issues at stake. Kleberg's unimpressive victory is a weak start to the general election campaign, where he will face off against state Sen. Dawn Buckingham, R-Lakeway, who won her run-off without a sweat over her own rando opponent, Pastor Tim Westley.

Lakeway is in the new Texas House District 19, which will likely be repped in the Lege in January by former Austin City Council

Member Ellen Troxclair, who defeated indicted Austin cop (and former police union veep) Justin Berry by 13 points. "We won with truth, grit, & grace," Troxclair wrote on Twitter shortly after the race was called. The new HD 19 sweeps Western Travis County into a district that stretches from Burnet to Boerne to Fredericksburg. Troxclair also mentioned this week's school shooting in Uvalde, where her husband, Caleb, is from and his family still lives. "I can't imagine hugging my babies for the last time, and I am strengthened in my resolve to fight for our children," she wrote. We can only imagine her



Chaos at AUS: No End in Sight to Endless Lines

They're not even trying to sugarcoat it anymore: "As Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (AUS) prepares for a record-breaking summer, passengers flying out for Memorial Day Weekend should too," the airport announced in a May 23 press release. "Plan ahead, arrive early, and pack your patience' is AUS's advice for what the airport expects to be the busiest Memorial Day travel time in the airport's history." This comes after yet more breakdowns at the Transportation Security Administration checkpoints May 14 and 17 led to three-hour waits and backed-up crowds into the not-all-that-spacious landside lobby, then into the roadway. U.S. Rep. Lloyd Doggett, D-Austin, who's been raising hell as a congressman does when a federal agency is creating chaos at home, got his fellow House Appropriations subcommittee Chair Lucille Roybal-Allard, D-Calif. – he's over Health and Human Services, she's over Homeland Security – to grill TSA Administrator David Pekoske on the matter during his agency's budget hearing. They're not just sticking up for Austin travelers' right to fly; Doggett, in a letter to Pekoske, suggested that TSA develop "a specific contingency plan that may require treating passengers for **heat stroke** if substantial relief is not promptly provided." There are also concerns that the largely unmanaged crowds

would themselves be vulnerable to attack by foreign or domestic terrorists or the next mass shooter.

Doggett had learned earlier from Pekoske that TSA doesn't have a contingency plan for addressing its staffing crisis now, although it's asked for 2,500 more positions nationwide in the upcoming fiscal 2023 federal budget, which won't take effect until October. Like other lower-wage employers in Austin - TSA agent positions start at \$45,000 per year - the agency is trying to run its front lines with not nearly enough bodies, and it only takes a couple extra people calling in sick to make the whole thing blow up.

We in Austin can relate, but many of the people in those endless lines are not from Austin, and they think it's AUS who should have planned ahead and kept up with growth. This is kinda unfair, since everything got screwed up by COVID-19 - nobody knew how fast air travel would come back once pandemic rules were relaxed, and in Austin's case the answer is "as fast as possible." The latest on the hurry-up-and-grow push at AUS includes the city's pursuing an unusual eminent-domain strategy to force out its own leaseholder at the restored **South Terminal**, home to Allegiant Air, so it can more quickly build the full-size facility called for in the AUS expansion master plan. - Mike Clark-Madison

gun-reform stances in the 88th Texas Legislature; the last one passed more than a dozen anti-gun-control measures. Just a week before the election, Gun Owners of **America** – for people who think the National Rifle Association is just too soft - announced its endorsement of Troxclair. "Gun owners deserve a strong, proven Second Amendment champion like Ellen Troxclair to represent them in Austin, NOT someone like Justin Berry who joins with gun control groups to further erode your rights." Berry's transgression? He testified in favor of a bill that would have made straw purchases buying a gun for someone who cannot legally own one – a crime in itself.

For almost all Travis Dems, the statewides were the entire ballot, but a sliver in Southwest Austin chose Claudia Zapata as their champion to at least make Rep. Chip Roy, R-Dripping Springs, as miserable as possible. On the flip side, Republicans got to pick their cannon fodder to throw at Lloyd Doggett and Greg Casar in November - rematch-seeker Jenny Garcia Sharon in Doggett's new TX-37, and former Corpus Christi mayor (for 37 days) and bona fide weirdo Dan McQueen in Casar's TX-35.

Affordability Crisis Challenges Neighborhood Protections

City Council didn't take any action (and had not planned to) last Thursday on a draft proposal to expand entitlements for developers to build housing on the city's major commercial and transportation corridors. But its public discussion of the issue predictably highlighted longstanding divisions in our community over how Austin should grow.

"These issues that we're trying to wade through," Council Member Ann Kitchen reflected at the end of the long day, "I'm positive that we're all on the same page in what we want. And we need to have conversations where we're not vilifying each other. I'm not talking about us [Council] - as a community."

The draft proposal that sparked much debate focused on two ways to free up development of much-needed housing: loosening compatibility standards for commercial projects near single-family neighborhoods, and reducing minimum parking requirements to allow for more housing and less pavement. Austin's current compatibility standards were adopted in the 1980s to prevent new development from disrupting neighborhoods' character with oversized buildings. The regulations gradually constrain heights and increase setbacks on commercial (which includes multifamily) properties up to 540 feet from any properties either zoned or used as single-family housing. The goal is

to have staggered heights in that zone - the closer to homes, the smaller the buildings.

A 540-foot compatibility zone encompasses a lot of properties on the city's main corridors, which is where urbanists and NIMBYs alike say the city should focus on increasing housing and density, particularly as we start to see the results of the Project Connect transit system overhaul. Many sites on the corridors are technically eligible for increased height and reduced setbacks as part of the city's density bonus programs to incentivize affordable housing, such as the **vertical** mixed-use overlay, but compatibility standards trump density bonuses.

Austin's standards are much more restrictive than those in peer cities. Any 60-foot building (four to five stories, the most allowed on most properties on most corridors) has to be 300 feet (the length of a football field) away from the nearest single-family property line, and a 90-foot building (allowed by the VMU overlay) has to be more than 400 feet away. In Portland and Seattle, such compatibility zones don't surpass 50 feet; Houston, of course, has no such restrictions at all.

While all CMs agreed that the current regulations are choking housing along corridors. CM José "Chito" Vela urged Council not to make arbitrary decisions about how many feet to add or take away from the limits. "Our



compatibility limits are so strict that we might be able to cut it down ... and it may not have any impact." The draft proposal from Mayor Steve Adler, Mayor Pro Tem Alison Alter. and CMs Paige Ellis, Vanessa Fuentes, and Leslie Pool proposes raising allowable heights for any multifamily or mixed-use property on a corridor by 5 feet across the board. and also compressing the impact zone around triggering homes from 540 to 300 feet.

The other half of the draft proposal would significantly reduce parking minimums, allowing properties on "large" corridors

with robust transit to provide only 20% to 50% of the off-street parking currently required; "medium" corridors could see smaller reductions, to 50-75% of current code, with the exact percentage reductions to be hammered out later.

While speakers took varied stances on parking and other specifics of the proposals, District 3's Will Davis seemed to summarize the city's collective mood around housing: "We're in a full-on crisis at this point and, honestly, I pray most days that we will find relief." - Maggie Quinlan

FAMILIES FACING FORMULA SHORTAGE TURN TO LOCAL MILK BANK

A **baby formula shortage** that began with a product recall has snowballed into a national crisis, with the Biden administration flying in tens of thousands of pounds of formula from abroad starting last Sunday.

As of early May, 43% of U.S. baby formula was out of stock, according to the data firm Datasembly. Though Dell Children's Medical Center had not admitted any babies for malnutrition due to the shortage as of Tuesday, H-E-B is limiting the amount of baby formula per customer, and parents have been reaching out to Mothers' Milk Bank in Austin for help in previously unheard-of numbers.

"Right now families are in crisis," **Kim Updegrove**, executive director of the milk bank, told the Chronicle. "These infants must be fed. There's no tolerance for a brief starvation period for infants. We know for their brains, there is no catch-up development later if we don't feed kids now."

The milk bank has to prioritize feeding babies who are medically fragile, Updegrove said, and they serve babies in neonatal intensive care at more than 180 hospitals across the country. Normally the nonprofit doesn't receive requests for milk from families with healthy babies, but since the formula shortage started affecting Austin two weeks ago, they've received about 30 calls a week from families in need of pasteurized human milk. Families in need can expect to receive 39 ounces of milk for free from Mothers' Milk without a prescription.

Mothers' Milk Bank saw a 700% increase in prospective milk donors last week

Because postpartum mothers have shown up in droves to donate milk amid the shortage. Updegrove hopes that supplies will soon be high enough to offer more than that. A normal week brings 20 donor inquiries to the milk bank. Last week alone the bank heard from 160 women hoping to offer their milk, 700% more than an average week.

"The milk bank has been reaching out to the community of healthy lactating women," said Updegrove, to ask: "'We know you do it all and you're already exhausted, but we need you right now. And probably 35% of you won't be eligible to donate, but 65% of you on average will be able to become lifesavers. And we need you because the manufacturing companies have created a crisis.' And in the last two weeks we've been so pleased to see a tremendous outpouring. Women always kind of step up in a crisis and say, 'Pick me, what can I do? I'm tired but I can do it."

Updegrove said financial and milk donations will save lives during the shortage (which she doesn't expect to end soon due to ongoing supply chain issues), but in the long term, the country as a whole can avoid starving its infants with smart policy decisions. Updegrove said gaps in access to parental leave, work-from-home options, and health care specialists including lactation counselors prevent many healthy mothers from breastfeeding. "Going back to work after two weeks isn't enough time to recover from the birth, let alone create this whole new physiological process in lactation. We're interrupting that process when she needs that baby to start that cascade of physiological responses." - Maggie Quinlan

Hardcore-Nazi Austinite Wanted by the Law

The **Texas Department of Public Safety** is searching for a violent white supremacist who is believed to have moved from Pennsylvania to Austin last year. **Hardy Carroll Lloyd**, 44, is charged with making terroristic threats after DPS said he promised to "carry a firearm onto the **Texas State Capitol** grounds this weekend and challenge any law enforcement officer who tried to take enforcement actions against him." The department is offering a \$1,000 reward for information leading to Lloyd's arrest.

Lloyd is a lifelong bigot with an avowed hatred for women, people of color, Jews, the LGBTOIA community, and police, among many others. He calls himself the reverend of the Church of Ben Klassen, which he created to preach race war, and has spent much of his adult life in prison - on weapons charges. and then for violating his parole by promoting violence on social media. For example, after the 2018 attack on the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh that killed 11 and injured six others, Lloyd – then on probation, and specifically prohibited from using the internet to promote terrorism - couldn't help but encourage lone-wolf attacks against Jews and gun-ban advocates. He was sent back to federal prison until the end of 2020.

Members of the local antifascist community believe that after his release, Lloyd moved to the **Highland** neighborhood of Austin. They report that stickers and posters with messages such as "RaHoWa" (racial holy war), "White Pride," and "Fuck Diversity" began appearing in schoolyards, parks, and government buildings around the area in November. Now, Lloyd is thought to have moved to the **Southpark Meadows** area and fliers and stickers are appearing there.

Lloyd completed probation after his release and before moving to Austin, so he is once again free to dox and intimidate people online, which he does through the Church of Ben Klassen's website and Blogspot. It's from there that **Marianna Wright** was doxxed in November of last year.

Wright, who lives in the Rio Grande Valley, was the first to file suit against **Steve Bannon**'s **We Build the Wall** fraud. She says that Lloyd posted her picture on his website, called her an anti-white bigot, and asked his followers to supply him with more pictures – "legally." She took this information to several law enforcement agencies but was told that Lloyd's post was protected under the First Amendment and no action could be taken against him. The McAllen and Mission police departments "did absolutely nothing," Wright said. "They were completely unresponsive. Same with DPS and the FBI."

Wright noted that the language in Texas law governing online threats is vague and subject to

interpretation. "The officer receiving the complaint has discretion on whether to send it to an investigator. The investigator has discretion on whether to send it to a district attorney or assistant U.S. attorney. That person then has discretion on whether it's worth sending to a judge for a warrant or arrest. And then the judge has

discretion on whether they think this person needs to be dealt with. So there is language in the code, but that language is irrelevant, apparently, when you're a woman in Texas. And the man is a Nazi who has already served three terms in prison for threatening and provoking the murder of human beings." – Brant Bingamon

HELL OR HIGH WATER

Be it flood or fire, every Austin resident must be prepared for disasters to come by LINA FISHER

As you read this, half of Travis County is classified under high wildfire risk. Despite this Tuesday's much-needed storm, the county has been under a burn ban since May 11, the default mode that we reset to every couple of weeks. Whatever the current weather, local emergency managers and elected officials alike continue to hammer home the same sentiment: It's not if, but when, an out-of-control, California-sized wildfire could ravage Central Texas.

But if we get enough rain to avert that possibility in the long term, much of the region - in fact, some of the same places with the greatest wildfire risk - could instead be ravaged by flooding. What does it all mean? Preparing for doomsday is a fulltime job that requires all hands on deck.

WHAT'S A WOO-EE?

In late March, the National Weather Service issued what's called a red flag warning for the Austin and San Antonio metro areas, indicating increased wildfire risk due to dry conditions and high winds. Texas, along with other Southwest states, has experienced lengthening periods of drought due to climate change. According to the metrics used by fire departments to gauge wildfire risk - a formula known as the Energy Release Component that factors in both weather conditions and the amount of vegetation available to fuel a wildfire - 2022 has already exceeded all previous records in the Eastern Hill Country, or the western half of the Austin metro area.

How many people and properties are in the path of such a fire? A whole lot, not just in Austin but all over Texas. According to the risk assessment company Verisk, Texas is second only to California in the number of properties in danger. Most of these are located in what's called the wildland-urban interface, or WUI (pronounced "woo-ee"). which is just what it sounds like: where the city meets the country. The WUI covers 36% of the land area of the city of Austin and 59% of Travis County; while it's mostly on the west side, it does include river and creek bottomlands to the east.

This vast terrain has lots of brush and vegetation - including Ashe juniper, or "cedar," which is exceptionally hazardous when it dries out and then catches fire. Embers from such fires can travel up to a quarter-mile before burning themselves out, which is how a prescribed burn near Bastrop earlier this year sparked fires that brought back painful memories of the 2011 Labor Day blazes in the same area, the most destructive in Texas history.

The Bastrop County Complex fire, as it's officially known, was set off by a power line knocked down by a tree that was blown down by the high winds; ultimately, Bluebonnet Electric Cooperative and its tree-trimming vendor ended up settling dozens of lawsuits, including a \$5 million payout to the city, county, and school district for lost property value. In 2019, City Council Member Alison Alter requested an audit of Austin's wildfire preparedness, which delivered a similar verdict: Austin Energy lines and the trees around them pose the greatest threat, particularly west of MoPac - in Alter's District 10 and in Districts 6 and 8 to its north and south.

That's resulted in concrete changes being implemented now, Alter told the Chronicle. The areas of highest risk in D10 should be mitigated by the end of this year, and "I've been working with [AE] to accelerate that

work all across the city," she said. You may remember that part of the cascade of disasters caused by Winter Storm Uri in February 2021 likewise involved downed power lines on the west side, knocked out by ice-heavy tree limbs that left large parts of D10 without power (and water) both before and after the blackout caused by the near-failure of the Texas power grid.

BEING BETTER BUILDERS

Clearing these low-hanging branches is the low-hanging fruit, if you will, of wildfire risk management. The most important long-term mitigation strategy is to adopt specific building codes for properties in the WUI, as California has done statewide beginning in the 1980s. In Texas, a statewide mandate wouldn't fly, so it's up to each locality to figure out what to do on its own. Austin was the first major city in Texas to adopt a local WUI building code, integrated into the Land Development Code in 2020.

Austin Fire Marshal Tom Vocke explains that Austin's new code is in fact more stringent than WUI rules elsewhere; for example, most WUI codes establish a brush clearing buffer in that quarter-mile "ember zone," but in Austin that buffer area stretches for a mile and a half. Even with that extra room, "[We] opted to not push brush mitigation as a solution, [but] to focus on ignition-resistant construction as our primary means of providing protection, because brush grows back," Vocke said. "If we can get ignition-resistant construction in place, we know we have 20-30 years of good protection for the home," said Vocke.

"Ignition-resistant construction" includes not only the choice of building materials, but reinforcing doors, windows, roofs, and ductwork to keep embers out and installing spark arresters on chimneys. (In much of California, wood-burning fireplaces are not allowed at all, both for fire risk mitigation and to improve air quality.) But these WUI code provisions only apply to new construction; there is no way to mandate the "hardening" of existing homes.

The WUI code also addresses evacuation routes, particularly in the many cul-de-sac subdivisions and gated country club communities on Austin's western edge. Alter's Council colleague Mackenzie Kelly owes her 2020 victory over Jimmy Flannigan to neighbors in one such community, River Place, who opposed Flannigan's efforts to enable multifamily density on that one evacuation route. "We will not be able to build additional evacuation routes in communities that are one way in and one way out," says Alter. "That was faulty planning long ago. We can make sure that any new developments that are in the WUI absolutely have multiple exits.

"We experienced a low-probability highrisk event with Winter Storm Uri," she continued. "We need to treat wildfire as a high-probability high-risk event. And there is so much more that we need to be doing as a community, city, and county to be prepared to mitigate our risk."

PEOPLE NEED TO PARTICIPATE

Effective emergency preparedness, whether for wildfire or flood or winter storm or anything else, requires the public to do its part. The National Wildfire Coordinating Group lays out three overarching recommendations for mitigating risk:

- 1) Restoring and maintaining resilient landscapes.
- 2) Creating fire-adapted communities.
- 3) Responding to wildfires effectively.

The WUI code addresses the first of these. As for the second, Travis County currently has 20 Firewise Communities - a program of the National Fire Protection Association that certifies towns and neighborhoods with a wildfire preparedness plan - out of about 90 in the entire state. They include the entire cities of West Lake Hills (since 2008), Lago Vista (since 2011), and Jonestown (since 2012). Another 58 neighborhoods are "engaged" in the process of becoming Firewise, according to local fire officials.

Comanche Trail, overlooking Hippie Hollow along Lake Travis, is not one of these yet, but County Commissioner Brigid Shea, whose Precinct 2 includes the north shore of the lake as far as Volente, cites the neighborhood fire evacuation drill her office helped put on there as a model of community participation. Shea says the county

doesn't have the staff or budget to organize these drills on its own: "People might say. 'Why not pick a bigger neighborhood or a more diverse neighborhood?' Part of it was. a lot of people [out there] were retired, a lot of them had management experience. And they were willing to do it, and they had the time to do it. We leveraged their experience and their leisure time to create this."

The third prong of preparedness, the actual firefighting response, is also getting a makeover as a result of Alter's 2019 call for an audit. Most urban fire departments, including Austin's, train to respond to residential structure fires; they're unfamiliar with the specialized techniques required for wildfire response, and (again, unlike California) the state doesn't have the tools and resources to back them up, short of deploying the National Guard, who are even less well trained.

Austin Fire has had a wildfire division since 2012, but it's been focused on public engagement (including the Firewise program) and fuel mitigation - e.g., clearing brush. As a result of Alter's initiative, for the past six months the entire Austin Fire Department has been undergoing Responding to the Interface training, a program launched in 2019 with federal funding by the International Association of Fire Fighters, of which the Austin Firefighters Association is Local 975; former AFA Vice President Randy Denzer helped develop and beta-test the training, and Austin is the largest municipal fire service in the country to use it as a department. Last year, AFD created its first wildfire battalion, which will undergo even more specialized training that could take another year or two before it's ready to deploy as a first response.

BUT BEYOND THE CITY LIMITS ...

Unlike Austin's Emergency Medical Services Department, Austin Fire does not operate countywide, nor does Travis County have its own fire department to work with AFD the way the Travis County Sheriff's Office works with Austin police. Much of the WUI lies within the domains of 14 separate emergency services districts, or ESDs. created by the Texas Legislature over the years to bridge this gap and now often "their own fiefdoms," as Shea puts it. "They have their own fire chiefs, their own taxing authorities, and neither the counties nor the cities can tell them what to do, really."

Some of the ESDs overlap. Some are noncontiguous, such as ESD 4, served by AFD by interlocal agreement and including random bits of the Austin fringe north of the river, from Jester Estates in the west to Hornsby Bend in the east. Some include cities that don't have their own fire departments, such as Pflugerville. Some have their own fire codes. "It's not a perfect setup," Shea said understatedly, "to have all the wildfire response for a large urban county that has a very high wildfire rating to be managed by 14 independent fire districts."


Austin does, however, control 911 dispatch for the entire county, and AFD has opted into automatic-aid agreements with all the Travis County ESDs and some in Williamson County as well, meaning if Austin's fire stations or

equipment are closest to a fire, AFD will respond first. However, citing differences with how AFD is run, Hutto (WilCo ESD 3), Pflugerville (Travis ESD 2), and Manor (Travis ESD 12) have opted out of these auto-aid agreements. "If they had a large brush fire, we would not automatically send units over into Pflugerville," says AFD Assistant Chief of Operations Brandon Wade. While the department is considering offering RTI training to the ESDs, right now, said Wade, "We're trying to get our own members through the program, and it's going to take quite some time."

WHAT ABOUT THE FLOODS?

Before the Bastrop County Complex fire in 2011 - and a simultaneous blaze in Steiner Ranch, west of River Place, that was much less damaging but equally frightening – most Austinites didn't think that much about their fire risk. They are well aware, however, of the opposite risk here in Flash Flood Alley, the one type of natural disaster Austin encounters regularly and very destructively.

Kevin Shunk, floodplain administrator for the city of Austin and its liaison with the National Flood Insurance Program run by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, says unlike wildfire risk, which is widespread but not everywhere, "flood risk is spread throughout the entire city. It's all over the place. There are certainly areas that are higher-risk, comparing the two geologic

parts of the city, with the east side of Austin being more of a flatland [with a] wider floodplain." Shunk's job is to identify flood risks to review, devise projects to mitigate them, and help with community outreach and education. He says the main "tools in his toolbox" to mitigate risk are buyouts of high-risk neighborhoods and keeping up with stormwater infrastructure, which is the job of Shunk's Watershed Protection Department.

The highest-profile buyouts have been in

the Onion Creek watershed, Austin's largest. After disastrous floods in 2013 and 2015 (each time on Halloween), the city purchased more than 800 properties in the watershed, particularly at its eastern end near where Onion Creek enters the Colorado. "But that doesn't mean that we favor that alternative over any other," said Shunk. Watershed Protection also builds deten-

tion ponds to "hold water such that the downstream system can handle [it, and] reduce the rate that it's going to flow downstream." One such regional pond is being built at Baker School in Hyde Park, now the headquarters of the Alamo Drafthouse.

New developments are also required to install stormwater detention "to make sure they're not flooding their neighbors, basically," said Shunk. As for existing neighborhoods, and as with the WUI code, older areas like Tarrytown that were built before the floodplain regulations don't have this infrastructure; the rules would only kick in on properties that are being rezoned or subdivided. "When an individual lot redevelops, if they're just putting a house on the same lot," Shunk said, "they would not have to put detention on that property" – even if the new house is much bigger and

increases impervious cover on the lot, and thus the risk of downstream flooding.

Floodplain regulations also require safe access: "You have to be able to walk from a building to the right-of-way [i.e., the nearest street], all at an elevation at least one foot above the 100-year floodplain," Shunk said, which helps both residents and responders in an evacuation scenario. The city's emergency managers will ask Watershed Protection, "How high is the water going to get and

where's it gonna go? And how long is it going to be at that elevation?' That would help them plan for an evacuation."

A new statewide flood planning process initiated by the Texas Legislature is mapping flood regions across Texas with the input of local experts like those at Watershed Protection. The resulting plan could unlock funds for risk reduction projects needed in Austin along

Shoal and Waller creeks and along the misleadingly named Dry Creek in Highland Hills in Alter's D10, as well as more citywide infrastructure and buyouts. "We'll have a list of projects, and that can hopefully help to plan on possible funding," said Shunk.

Both flood and fire risk are increased by the Austin area's boom, as we continue to build closer to the WUI and the 100-year floodplain and weather becomes more unpredictable due to climate change. Risk mitigation therefore is shared across all of Austin's communities, whether we like it or not. "We need to step up and be prepared for a totally different kind of disaster planning," said Alter. "One where we can't just call on our neighbor next door to help us. We have to make sure that we have resilience within our community, within our system. So that we survive whatever comes our way."

Kitties Still Got Claws

Austin's legendary burlesque troupe Kitty Kitty Bang Bang is getting back together for the Texas Burlesque Festival by RICHARD WHITTAKER

A shimmy, a shake, a tease. The sound of seashells heavily hitting the stage floor.

Stacey Breakall laughs at the memory. It was 2001, and the first-ever performance of Kitty Kitty Bang Bang, the legendary Austin burlesque troupe she founded. There she was onstage, under her nom de plume of Tijuana Trixie, midway through a seductive siren-themed number. "We had some pasties out of seashells," she said, "and what we learned was that seashells are too heavy to be pasties. There's a big reveal, and seashells are just popping off left and right. I think people in the audience got a little bit more than they were expecting."

"You could hear the little 'clink," added Marita De La Torre, aka the stripping Southern assassin Venus Velvet, "and you were like, 'I wonder whose that one was?' and keep dancing."

Twenty years later, and a decade since their last performance, five of the original seven members of Kitty Kitty Bang Bang are reuniting for a final lingerie fling at the Texas Burlesque Festival.

That one night, June 4 at the Long Center, is the tribute to these godmothers of the still-vibrant Austin burlesque scene that they helped define, its highfalutin stage a far

remove from their early days playing clubs and speakeasies. Back then, the exotic arts were so underground, the audience needed educating. This was 2001, when most people associated burlesque with the Pussycat Dolls on TV and Moulin Rouge! in cinemas. They may never have seen a burlesque show in person before, and the ladies of Kitty Kitty Bang Bang realized that they needed to give the crowd permission to play their part in the production. De La Torre explained, "We'd always start with, 'More than anything, this is about fun. You can hoot and holler."

"We still do that, even at the festival," said TBF Director Terri Lynn Raridon. "Practice your best wolf whistle and catcall, because you're gonna need it because these performers have to have it, and they're not gonna take it off if they don't hear it."

Even if those early audiences were thinking of a millennial, Hollywood-glam version of burlesque, what Breakall and De La Torre were looking to bring back was the true golden era of the ecdysiast's art, and most especially the leggy legacy of Gypsy Rose Lee. Breakall had been entranced by her work since seeing the 1993 biopic Gypsy in high school ("Thanks, mom!"). She recalled. "I just loved the over-the-top costumes, and that playful sense of sexuality onstage." New regional burlesque scenes were starting to pop up internationally, given luscious life by Canada's Fluffgirl Burlesque Society and the Shim Shamettes in New Orleans, and Breakall wanted to bring the most professional version of the art to Austin that

> she could, even drawing up a business plan. "I knew that because it was something new, and because I was asking people to get onstage and take off their clothes, they would need to know that I was serious."

> The first number she called was her old college friend De La Torre, already a fixture on the Austin theatre and dance scene, and, as Breakall credited her, one of those people who just knows everyone. "I guess I

was that person that people would go, 'I want to do this, call Marita!" De La Torre said, but there was something special in the double trouble she and Breakall could create. "She had the marketing business brain and I had the theatre production know-how, so here we go, unite, and Wonder Twin powers activate."

That first show, they didn't even put the troupe's name over the door, just the words "Burlesque Show." But that was enough to get audiences through the door and turn that first shell-shedding performance into a local institution. "Austin was ready," De La Torre said.

Not that there wasn't burlesque in Austin before these Kitties polished their claws. However, it was generally built around occasional shows like Burlesque for Peace, while peers like Red Light Burlesque were less troupes and more ensembles, with a series of soloists. The Kitty Kitty Bang Bang experience was built around themed shows, group pieces, and showstoppers with every dancer disrobing in unison. There was music, an emcee, a full-fledged vaudeville atmosphere, and shows would run for a full season. The ladies would throw away their 10-gallon hats (and a lot more) for the deeply Texan El Rancho, mob up as Prohibitionera molls for Cabaret Rouge, or do up just enough buttons on their trenchcoats for Spies, Thighs, and Private Eyes. "It was a vaudeville setup," said De La Torre.

A couple of years in and the shows were getting to the level of performance and theatrical complexity Breakall et al. wanted, so they started looking for a director. Enter Raridon, owner of Forbidden Fruit, future Texas Burlesque Festival director, and theatrical producer and choreographer, whose very first production in Austin was a Capital City Playhouse production of Gypsy, the 1959 musical based on the striptease legend's life. "It was a natural transition for me," Raridon said. "We did shows that were scripted. You're seeing burlesque in a theatrical production."


Jump to 2022, and it was actually Raridon's idea to bring the Bangers back together ("I'll take the blame for that," she said), not least because there would be no Texas Burlesque Festival without them. It was they who founded it in 2007, and she only took on the leadership role in 2009, the year that the troupe dissolved. Coming out of a two-year pandemic hiatus, she wanted to give them "one last swan song."

Right now, the Kitties are working on getting back in step, rehearsing one of their old and most beloved routines for one last display of dancing exhibitionism. It'll be just like the old days, complete with their longtime emcee David Lampe (aka Harvey Touchbottom) and his signature cape, while Venus Velvet will be sporting the original boots she wore the first time around. For De La Torre, the night will be like the old days in one specific and vital way: "We knew that it was always going to be playful, meaning full of play. That's what always drove our brand of burlesque, and why, when we think about our reunion, we think, 'I get to play."



Austin's Y'All We Asian wraps up Asian American & Pacific Islander Heritage Month with a Big Ol' Comedy Showcase by valerie LOPEZ

Is there a better way to celebrate Asian American & Pacific Islander Heritage Month than with a comedy show? Not just any comedy show, but a Big Ol' Comedy Showcase hosted by Y'all We Asian, Austin's (and Texas') original all-Asian American improv troupe. The May 27 extravaganza will celebrate five years of bringing their brand of collaborative comedy to Austin audiences by combining the celebration of Asian culture with stand-up, improv, sketch, storytelling, and more.

Founding member Yola Lu traced the origin of the Y'all We Asian troupe back to 2017 when she. Kim Tran (now based in Spain and supporting from afar), and a small group of comics and improvisers sought to create an all-Asian comedy showcase. Lu said that when the first show sold out she realized that "people were just excited to see that there was an Asian American showcase in town." The troupe adopted the name Y'all We Asian and launched the monthly all-Asian showcases Summer Vacation and Starring Y'all We Asian at Coldtowne Theater. In July 2020, they opened the monthly show Y'all We Asian: Family Style at Fallout Theater, and Lu said it's a badge of honor that the monthly shows have enjoyed a record of selling out each time.

Lu's aim with the annual May celebration of the troupe's anniversary (which she lovingly refers to as the "flagship show") is simple: "I really wanted to get a community of people together to come celebrate Asian American comedy. ... We're trying really hard to kind of make this seem like a really big Asian American comedy party." This year's show is hosted and headlined by Y'all We Asian and will feature stand-up performers Peng Dang, KC Shornima, Paul Smith, Liem Nguyen, and Arun Rama. Musical comedy will be provided by Cheryl

Cruz, and Lu promises Asian food vendors, a photo booth, and a full bar.

Beyond the work that Lu and Y'all We Asian does on Austin stages, the stand-up comic, improviser, and actress launched a community of Asian American performers through Disoriented Comedy 10 years ago. The mostly female stand-up comedy tour became a national movement celebrating Asian American women in comedy as well as introducing Asian audiences to comedy. Lu said it was important to create spaces for both Asian American performers and audience members to participate in comedy safely and without fear of being singled out for being different. If you've been paying attention to the comedy specials released by streaming networks lately, you've noticed the greater representation of Asian American comics. Austin has been fortunate to be a regular destination for national touring comics such as Ronny Chieng, Margaret Cho, Jimmy O. Yang, Jo Koy, and others (hint: If you're just discovering these Asian American comedy heavy hitters, go find their specials online).

The party atmosphere at this weekend's show is partly brought on by the fact that after five years of success, Y'all We Asian has been an unparalleled leader in bringing Asian American comedy to Austin and Texas audiences. My conversation with Lu ended with her saying, "I'm just really excited for the audience to be excited and laughing."



music and performances," Lavender Thug says. "Plus for the first time we'll have free testing at the event provided by the Kind Clinic, so that's extra exciting!"

In curating the lineup for the last Saturday of every month, Lavender Thug says the **show** prioritizes Latinx performers and DJs. "as there's not always spaces we can do Spanish songs and have everyone in the audience know and love them." That includes songs like the namesake tune "Cuchi-Cuchi," by the iconic Charo. Attributing the initial show title choice to how suitably catchy and subtly salacious the song is. Lavender Thug says that after digging into the Spanish American artist's history she found a connection to her own life. "I learned she was an immigrant who used her talent playing instruments and singing to rise to fame and make a name for herself after so many hardships," Lavender Thug explains, "which was extremely inspirational as I just moved to Austin this year." Another fact that makes the singer/actress an icon in her eyes? "Charo is KILLER on a guitar!"

While it's not the only drag show in town, Lavender Thug maintains that Cuchi Cuchi's special power is creating Latinx joy: people dancing to mariachi, cumbia, reggaeton, and dembow, and drag performances that embody the culture. "It all just makes the whole night feel like home," she says. "Like a family party with your crazy cousins and chismosa tías, it's just pure fun all night long."

DAY TRIPS

BeeWeaver Honey Farm near Navasota creates a lot of buzz. Not only do they raise their own breed of queen bees, but they also have a store of bee-related products, a meadery, and overnight accommodations.

An exciting aspect of the farm is the opportunities to meet the bees. Throughout the year, the **melittologists** offer tours. classes, and tastings covering everything from beekeeping to baking with honey or simply taking a look into a hive (from behind a protective screen).

The **Weaver family** started in the bee business in 1888 when Florence and Zachariah received 10 bee colonies as a wedding gift. Their son expanded the farm about halfway between Austin and Houston into the commercial honey and queen-bee trade. Today, Laura and Dan Weaver are fourth-generation stewards of the apiary.

Not only do bees produce honey, but they also pollinate many of the foods we eat. Weather, habitat loss, and pesticides have reduced the number of beneficial bugs. "It's not easy being a bee these days," Laura says.

That's why it's important to educate the public to be less fearful of bees. On Saturday, May 28, is BeeWeaver's BuzzFest.

"It's a day of interactive, hands-on learning," Laura says. Along with other honey-related companies, there will be tastings, music, and food trucks.

"Every year we try to make a 'bee beard' on someone," Laura says. "It doesn't



always work, but when it does it makes a great photo op."

Laura's favorite bee joke: Where did Noah keep his bees? In his "ark hive."

BeeWeaver Honey Farm is between Navasota and Hempstead about two hours from Austin. The store opens daily and WildFlyer Mead Co. opens Thursday through Sunday. Tours and classes require advance reservations.



THE VERDE REPORT BY ERIC GOODMAN

Opening the Books on Austin FC's Salary Figures

Until further notice, **Major League Soccer** is a **salary-capped** league, meaning teams are limited in how much money they can spend on their rosters. Also until further notice, the league prefers not to tell you, the interested fan, anything about what your favorite team is spending or what your favorite team is spending or what your favorite player is making. Thankfully the MLS Players Association is much less secretive. It releases a biannual salary guide listing every MLS player's guaranteed compensation, so the world can see which clubs are getting the best value from their squad, and which ones are flushing money down the **Gonzalo Higuaín** toilet.

With the spring 2022 salary guide fresh off the presses, let's take a look at some notable nuggets from the Austin FC portion of the report. (Quick disclaimer: MLS clubs often warn that the numbers reflected in the MLSPA salary guide are incomplete, to which I reply, my DMs are open for more accurate figures! Please send at your leisure.)

Austin FC Ranks 13th in Total Spending

The Verde and Black currently sit second overall in the Supporters' Shield standings, despite being middle of the pack in total roster spending. The club's total wage bill of \$13.75 million is barely two-thirds of the LA Galaxy's league-topping budget of \$20.13 million. That's due almost entirely to the clubs' Designated Players, the three players per team whose wages don't count against the salary cap. All three of Austin's earn a combined \$5.7 million, which is less than what Galaxy striker Javier "Chicharito" Hernández rakes in by himself.

Sebastián Driussi Leads the Wav

The Argentine maestro is fittingly Austin FC's top earner at \$2.3 million, which is currently looking like an absolute steal. **Sebastián Driussi** leads Major League Soccer in total goal contributions with eight goals and four assists and is well on his way to MVP consideration by season's end.

Best Value: Brad Stuver

On the other side of the spectrum is starting goalkeeper **Brad Stuver**, who at just \$185,000 in total compensation is giving Austin FC the biggest bang for its buck in 2022. In addition to being a fan favorite,

Stuver's role on the pitch and in the locker room is integral to the club's identity. The former career backup keeper is still playing on the initial contract he signed with Austin FC in 2021, which has him as the 35th highest-paid goalkeeper in MLS, behind even his backup. **Andrew Tarbell**.

Honorable mentions: **Daniel Pereira** (\$102,000), **Diego Fagúndez** (\$450,000)

Worst Value: Jhohan Romaña

It's hard to believe after **Jhohan Romaña** started more than half of Austin FC's games in 2021 that the Colombian center back has yet to log a single minute of action this season. Not only has he lost his starting place beside **Julio Cascante** to offseason signing **Ruben Gabrielsen**, but Romaña has also fallen behind rookie **Kipp Keller** on the depth chart for substitute opportunities. His guaranteed compensation of \$440,000 puts him 10th on the roster in that regard, and so far that sum of cash has yet to see the field.

Honorable mentions: **Rodney Redes** (\$412,500), **Andrew Tarbell** (\$300,000)

Best Addition: Maxi Urruti

Several newcomers have made an immediate impact on Austin FC this season, including Gabrielsen, **Ethan Finlay**, and **Felipe Martins**. But the best acquisition of a busy winter offseason has thus far been striker **Maxi Urruti**. In addition to scoring four goals and chipping in one assist, Urruti has brought stability to Austin FC's most unstable position from last season. His friendship with fellow Argentine attacker Driussi has helped both to flourish through the first third of the 2022 season. His services are costing ATXFC \$661,250 for the year.





Back into the Danger Zone

Tom Cruise tries to prove that he's the last great movie star with delayed legacy sequel Top Gun: Maverick by trace sauveur

We can just get this out of the way right from the jump: Tom Cruise rules. As basically the personification of the last dying breath of the age of true movie stars, he constantly puts his all into making movies designed for the biggest screen possible, and with all the work it takes to make it look believable. He refuses to settle for less - he may just be the last Hollywood star that has not resorted to streaming. He's the man who has

broken an ankle during a stunt and kept running to keep the take, performed several actual HALO jumps for the sake of realism, and only agreed to come back to the world of Top Gun if everything could be done practically.

And that's exactly what Top Gun: Maverick delivers. This 25-plus-year-belated sequel to

the Eighties cultural phenomenon isn't just an improvement on the dated original, it's an altogether exhilarating summer action blockbuster in its own right, in no small part because of the amazing, real aerial feats and photography, beautifully captured and built for you to make your way to an Imax screen. While the sorely missed Tony Scott's original film nowadays has its own nostalgic charm and its own impressive sequences, it's tough to say it's satisfying from any sort of narrative standpoint. Maverick picks up that slack and crafts a classically simple, but

graceful and affecting, comeback story designed to give you the most bang for your buck.

Catching up with Pete "Maverick" Mitchell (Cruise), we find that he never quite left his lonewolf hotshot days behind, still a captain pulling tricks when he could be much more. He's called back to the United States Navy Strike Fighter Tactics Instructor program – the eponymous Top Gun - for a daunting mission: teaching a group of

> pilots their way through a near-impossible attack on a (notably anonymous) enemy uranium plant. Oh, and one of his students is Rooster (Teller), the son of his old buddy Goose who died in his arms 30 years prior. There's tension there, but maybe they each have something to learn from each other. Who knows? As he also catches up with an old flame, Penny (Connelly), and

deals with the likes of tough, by-the-book disciplinarian Cyclone (Hamm), Maverick has to grow alongside his students to finally become the man he's refused to mature into.

It's pretty straightforward, but don't think that means it's not gripping. I was surprised how invested this made me in character arcs and plot lines picked up from a movie I mostly don't care about; the climax has an emotional backbone that's downright cathartic. It's also completely badass, as are the rest of the fighter jet sequences, which find a balance between

function and beauty as the camera takes you from gorgeous wides of these things bolting through the air to inside the cockpit with the actors, who are all performing from inside these planes. Director Joseph Kosinski (Tron: Legacy, Cruise's Oblivion), with his regular cinematographer Claudio Miranda, finds all the right angles to make this a totally grandiose, cheer-out-loud affair, with a script that's all meat and no fat. This is the ideal example of a big summer blockbuster and one of the best legacy sequels we've ever gotten: a movie that knows how to move along and give you what you came for.

It also frequently feels like a knowing testament to Cruise as a performer, specifically as one of the last of a certain generation of stars, and certainly dealing in some melancholy as a once-in-a-lifetime performer is only getting older. When Ed Harris' character Rear Admiral Cain warns Mayerick that drone-controlled aircrafts will soon replace analog operation, the daredevil pilot simply retorts: "Maybe so, sir. But not today." And as he climbs into that cockpit to deliver what will ultimately be one of the most tangible. impressive, invigorating movies of the summer, it's hard not to read it all as a celebration of a man who refuses to leave the danger zone.

Boy, Liust love H. Jon Benjamin, The first time I heard him was in an episode of Home Movies on Adult Swim back in the early 2000s. I loved the show in general, but Benjamin's Coach McGuirk made me laugh whenever he was on screen. Benjamin also voiced characters on episodes of another of my favorite shows, Aqua Teen Hunger Force, as well as dozens of other shows including Archer, Assy McGee, and WordGirl, and even when he's on camera in shows like Wet Hot American Summer: First Day of Camp and Parks and Recreation, it's his voice that is so distinctive; that low monotone, so he perpetually sounds bored, sleepy, and high. I can't imagine anyone else voicing Bob Belcher in Bob's Burgers. He is Bob.

The Bob's Burgers Movie is basically a very special episode of Bob's Burgers, an extended episode of the show. That's not a bad thing, folks. Bob (Benjamin) and Linda (Roberts) have an impending payment due on their loan, and not paying it means losing the business. They have one week to come up with the money OR ELSE. Naturally, a giant sinkhole opens up right in front of the restaurant, blocking the entrance and stopping anyone from coming in, just as business should be booming because of the Octo-Wharfiversary (the 80th anniversary of the nearby Wonder Wharf). Meanwhile, Louise (Schaal) gets teased at school and she's out to prove something to herself that sets her and her siblings, Tina (Mintz) and Gene (Mirman), up to solve a mystery. The Belchers are in for the week of their lives.

Directed by series creator and Home Movies co-creator Loren Bouchard, The Bob's Burgers Movie is a goddamn delight, very funny, and so sweet and charming. You know this weird, quirky family really loves each other. Many of the nonfamily regulars are in this, too, with the farfrom-loving millionaire Fischoeders (Galifianakis, Kline, and Wain), and Bob's Burgers regular Teddy (Murphy). In keeping with the smallscreen-to-big-screen jump, the movie even has musical numbers (yes, numbers with an S!) and the animation looks great, slick and crisp. It's beautiful, really. Sure, the mystery isn't really that much of a mystery, but who cares, it's fun to watch the kids try to figure it out. It doesn't



The history of pandemic cinema has yet to be written. The film industry did not shut down entirely over the past two years, but so many of the stories that emerge from the pandemic are still over-defined by their production. Montana Story, a new film from the indie duo behind Uncertainty, The Deep End and What Maisie Knew, is another film both shot and set in the middle of the pandemic, but the story it sets out to tell stands on its own. If history is kind, perhaps it may emerge as one of the best of the bunch.

Hearing that his father has suffered a stroke and is now receiving end-of-life care, Cal (Teague) returns to his Montana homestead to settle his affairs. His father - now in a coma - was a prominent local businessman, but an act of unspoken cruelty toward Cal's sister, Erin (Richardson), following some moment of high

school rebellion severed their relationship. Now Cal and Erin face an uncertain homecoming as they address their father's final days and prepare to close an estate that is deeply in debt.

Most stories about the dving find their profundity in the survivors, and Montana Story is no different. We have seen versions of these siblings before, but Teague and Richardson embody the contradictions they've been asked to play. Both actors capture a younger generation who retains a certain fondness for open plains even as they reject the violence and exploitation that underwrites that mythos. This is Teague's film; the actor – who so often appears to be playacting at normalcy onscreen - carries Cal's burden well, never quite tipping the scales to melodrama even as the script gestures to bigger moments. Similarly, Richardson feels both

The Fastest Movies in Texas

The 48 Hour Film Project celebrates 20 years in Austin

Grab your camera and your crew: On June 10. filmmakers will gather at Kick Butt Coffee to kick off this year's Austin version of the 48 Hour Film Project – an event and organization committed to giving armchair directors a taste of the film industry over a single weekend, and there's still time for you to sign up.

The 48 Hour Film Project strives to create an inclusive environment that encourages representation for all communities. "The 48 is not just for people who have the training, and it's for anybody who doesn't even fit the Hollywood mold," Austin project producer Keira Marti said. "I would love to see filmmakers from every type of community here. I would love for everybody to come and make a film."

Originally launched in Washington, D.C., in 2001, the 48 Hour Film Project now takes place in 130 cities worldwide, including five in Texas. Austin - one of the first cities to pick up the project – will celebrate its 20th anniversary with the organization this year, making for an even sweeter return to in-person screenings following COVID-19.

By stripping back multimillion-dollar budgets and power imbalances that often prevent smaller artists from finding stardom in Hollywood, the project allows local artists to tell their stories and even reach film industry representatives looking for new talent. While it attracts filmmakers from all walks of life and experience levels, all participating artists are united by the common goal to celebrate local filmmaking. Marti, who joined the project as a volunteer in 2015 before becoming a producer three years later, said, "I call it a Lone Star state of mind when it comes to filmmaking. it's a lot less about the executives, and more about the actual filmmaking."

Though participating teams enjoy complete creative control over their films, a few guidelines exist to measure completeness of each film and generate ideas at the beginning of the 48 hours. On Friday night, teams of varying size will select a random genre from a hat, and producers will assign

them a random character, prop. and line to include in their film. Teams must include all assigned elements in their films, or they face disqualification.

Judging takes place June 20-21, when all eligible films are screened for live audiences. While a different selection of judges work the project each year, producers often bring acting recruiters or film directors who could further the careers of local filmmakers. For Alyne Harding, a Austin project producer since 2013, it grants artists opportunities she dreamed of in 2012, when she was a working mom trying to get hired. "This project spurred on other careers for people who were ready to give up," she said. "People who didn't have much confidence in [themselves] see what they can do. I've had other filmmakers tell me this was going to be their last attempt, and then they win or they make the top 10."

Many artists learned the ropes of filmmaking at the 48 Hour Film Project (The Hobbit star Martin Freeman's short "The Girl Is Mime" even won the competition in 2010). Wining groups could be selected to compete at the Filmapalooza – a festival where 48 Hour participants can attend workshops and compete against fellow competitors around the globe. A handful of Filmapalooza winners are selected to showcase their work at the Cannes Film Festival. Though Austin's 48 Hour Film Project has not sent any groups to Cannes so far, Marti and Harding hope the chapter's 20th anniversary this year will grant participants some extra luck. "To make a 48 film here is to become part of our family." Marti said. "You can see that in every one of our screenings where people are talking to each other and networking."

For their part, co-directors (and writers) Scott McGehee and David Siegel never try to do too much. The Montana of their film blurs the line between civilization and the frontier: so much of the tone of the film comes from how these characters are framed against the sweeping landscapes surrounding the farm. Westerns have always thrived on sweeping landscapes and off-center framing, and the visual language of the film - so empty, so beautiful - serves as a beautiful counterpoint to the two performances. We do not need dialogue explaining why these two siblings would cling so close to each other in youth. The emptiness of the world around them says everything we could hope to know.

There are a handful of filmmakers - Wind River director Taylor Sheridan comes to mind - who carry the torch of the American Western forward into the present. Like Sheridan's films, Montana Story introduces an element of finality to the American West. The house is sold, the siblings return to their respective cities, and the mythos that drove their respective childhoods seems forever punctured by the violence of the men who idolized it. Perhaps Montana Story is part of a new wave of films that herald the death of the Western - movies that see the genre through to its modern, natural conclusion. For the Western, stories of death may be all that remains, but this proves they are still stories worth telling.



Your Beer Garden Friends, the Beergardigans, Return!

Austin Kids Grade Local Breweries, Vol. 2 BY ERIC PUGA

For those of you just now being enlightened to the existence of Austin's premier pint-sized brewery critics, the Beergardigans - Enzo: 10, Theo: 6, and Tallulah: 4 - we recommend that you momentarily put down this piece of Pulitzer-caliber literature and catch up on Volume 1 of the series somewhere on the internet ("Austin's Best Breweries. According to Children," Food, Oct. 1, 2021). In that story, we discussed the most pressing question keeping the coffee-and-emojiaddled parents of Central Texas socially anxious: Do my children belong at the brewery? And we answered: Yes! Hell yes they do! No more and no less than pups, or Californians, or tech bros named Asp Patagonia decamping to the taproom with their 23-deep bachelor party squad (#AspFest!), sampling 17 1-ounce beers at a time while a line stretches to Hutto behind them.

We've said it often, but we'll say it again: Breweries are communal spaces intended for a spectrum of beer garden experiences like graduation celebrations, Sunday fundays, bike crawls, and yes, post-T-ball family outings. A good beer garden has *just* enough "LET'S GOOOO!" caterwauling from the bitcoin bois as it does from the waning toddlers, so long as each group minds their own spaces.

Not these kids though. Not the Beergardigans. They're perfectly calm and composed and seamlessly integrate into any social setting like little Jürgen Klopps. That's why they're qualified to bring you sizzling takes from the perspective of grade school know-it-alls. They'll tell your kids what's up, and by default manage your whole squad's weekend like they're setting up key pieces to Liverpool's run for the cup. So, here they are, the Beergardigans back for Volume 2. Enjoy 'em while they're still young.

"There were a lot of fuzzy caterpillars. They were lovely." – Theo

The most prominent feature of Live Oak's beer garden and brewery is its connection to nature (WHY, IT'S RIGHT THERE IN THE NAME!). And while everyone's mileage

may vary regarding their affection for fat caterpillars on their undulating journey toward final form, you can be sure that the best way for a grownup to experience Live Oak is beneath their grove of native Texas trees, drinking world-class Pilsners and various other platinum-grade lagers. The littles, meanwhile ...

"I love all the shade trees but not the bugs." - Tallulah (not into bugs)

"Both caterpillars and kids have so much space. That's always good for any brewery. But I would definitely wear pants here." – Enzo (also not into bugs)

"It's very easy for kids to make friends here with other kids because there are always a lot of kids and the tables are very long and you can share the end of the table to play [with] toys. But it would be very rare to ever see them again." – Theo

While one of the Beergardigans internally wrestles with ephemeral beer garden life, the others move on to brewery grub,

expertly handled by the steady presence of Live Oak's resident Bavarian-style food truck, the Black Forest.

"The pretzel ... with queso." – Tallulah, on her favorite part of Live Oak

"I rate the pretzel very high, but the [dipping-sized] queso wasn't my favorite. I also ate a hot pepper [from the pick-led veggie plate] and it made my mouth

burn for three minutes. You said it wouldn't be spicier than Hot Cheetos and you LIED." – Enzo

Technically, dads have legal immunity from tricking their kids into eating spicy foods, so no crime was committed here. Besides, there were plenty of other distractions around Live Oak to divert from the trauma of distrust, like an actual in-house brewery hound and planes screaming into Austin-Bergstrom from above.

"I loved the airplanes landing right over my head but they were loud!" – Theo

"They were very big and coming from far away and I think they were

bringing people to the brewery." – Tallulah "That dog was huge and hairy!" – Theo

"The brewery dog was really cool because he could just walk around on his own wherever he wanted to smell and the [brewery] owner could call it back from far away with just one whistle. You should do that for us!" – Enzo

Beergardigans' Brewery Grade: B+ 6015 Dillard Cir. Ste. A, thebrewtorium.com

"I don't like that it doesn't have a playground. I know that every brewery has a playground but this one doesn't." – Theo

True, the Brewtorium is an urban beer garden fit snugly within Austin's central corridor, but that's about the only amendment to a traditional, kid-friendly brewery usually found in the Hill Country. But what the Brewtorium lacks in playgrounds and whirligigs, it makes up twentyfold in courtyard comfort and approachable menu items for even the pickiest of palates.

"Five out of five for the pretzel. No, wait, 10 out of 10." – Enzo, expert soft pretzel appraiser

"It's my favorite menu of all the breweries." – Theo

"The [beer] cheese is really good. I couldn't even tell there was beer in it." – Enzo

"Yummy in my tummy." – Tallulah, picking at sliced bratwurst and soft pretzel from the Smörgåsbord

See? The kids are happy here and definitely not dragged there by Mom and Dad solely to relish some of the best hazy ales and lagers in town under multiple beer garden sail shades.

"I feel welcome here. We usually sit outside and I like that better [than sitting inside] because I like when the train goes by. The inside is kind of boring because it doesn't have a train." – Enzo

The Brewtorium's notable ease of ordering and cavernous interior are set up with

families in mind, particularly multifamily walk-ups from the surrounding North Loop/Highland neighborhoods who find counter service a much easier arrangement for larger groups, or the passing soccer squad looking for a swift happy hour dinner on their way to Q2 Stadium via the Red Line.

"My favorite parts are how they cater to what kids like to eat and drink like Dr Pepper and juice boxes. And it's a fun place to play games with your family. But bring a screen as backup just in case someone loses and doesn't want to play anymore." – Enzo

"I ONLY have fun here! I saw two other kids having fun too. They were my brothers." – Tallulah, overemotional as a result of an Uno triumph

"Do I like this brewery? I'm in the middle. It has good views of trains and helicopters. I like all the plants and the decorations. The Sprite is sparkling. [Thinks deeply for a moment] Actually, I DO like this brewery even though there's no playground. Can I use your phone yet?" – Theo

FRONTYARD BREWING

Beergardigans' Brewery Grade: A+ 4514 Bob Wire Rd., frontyardbrewing.com

"It wasn't just a brewery. It was a MAGICAL brewery." – Theo

First impressions of Frontyard Brewing will tell you that it is bougie as hell and that your kids are probably fated to spoil all the nice things there, but after a few moments of consideration one can discern that A LOT of thought was put into making Frontyard actually look like someone's backyard. Someone who might actually have kids

of their own! Durability! Fake turf! A dirt mound! Unfixed seating options! Make these people Spicewood's PARENTS OF THE YEAR right this minute. I demand it!

"I love it as a place for kids to go but parents will like it too. There's a lot of space for me to play and dance. My favorite part was all the room to do handstands." – Tallulah

"There's A LOT of random kids here but still plenty of space to play with my toys. And we did a somersault challenge to see

who could get the sweatiest. It is very grassy so we weren't in the way of grownups." – Theo

"You can play so many games and sports here: Frisbee, soccer, football ... maybe baseball. You can't play basketball though." - Enzo

"But you CAN play pickle golf." – Theo, conflating the latest athletic craze, pickleball

Yes, pickleball courts are a prominent feature of Frontyard's property for families fresh off the marina. A sign says that

they take reservations for the courts, which I was far too lazy to look further into on my phone, so I lied and said there weren't any more appointments that day. It was very hot.

"They have pickleball courts but we used them to play soccer tennis, instead. That was fun! It's unique for a brewery to have an option like that. It's the best brewery I've seen with the most activities for kids [and] one of my favorites so far." – Enzo "If you're big, like maybe 10 or 11, your parents can drop you off and you can just walk around wherever you want." - Tallulah

While the temptation to ditch our kids is always fascinating, we enjoyed the entire property as a family, including taking in the hilly vistas from the edge of the property only afforded to overpriced Airbnbs in Canyon Lake while we chowed on two of the four basic-kid food groups offered by Frontyard's

on-site trucks: pizza (Neapolitan) and soft pretzels. The grownups attended to Frontyard's stunning hot-weather drink choices: a Mexican lager and a blonde ale that were each exceptional, house-syrup flavored seltzers, and wine from property mates, 5 Soul Wine. The Backyardigans enjoyed house-made Frontyard root beer.

The Austin Music **Census Returns While the Live Music Fund Faces Delays**

In 2015, the first Austin Music Census highlighted fault lines in the local music economy still referenced in current policymaking - including that 75% of musicians fell below Austin's average annual wage, with one-third of musicians making less than \$15,000 annually.

Last week, partners including Mayor Steve Adler and KUTX announced plans to launch a new survey to provide a "health check" on the music ecosystem. Starting June 20, the 10to 15-minute online census will be open for three weeks to music industry workers living or working in the Greater Austin area, including Travis, Williamson, Hays, Caldwell, and Bastrop counties. The group seeks responses from musicians, venue owners, music nonprofits, music business professionals, and beyond.

Whereas the 2015 survey was commissioned by the City of Austin and conducted by Titan Music Group, this edition will be overseen by Austin-based company Sound Music Cities. Former Austin Music & **Entertainment Division Manager Don** Pitts launched Sound Music Cities after running the city music office since its inception in 2010, where he conceived the Austin Music Census idea. He departed local government in 2017 while on administrative leave amid an audit investigation into his handling of an employee filing a fraudulent vendor invoice for \$2,500 in travel costs.

His research group has been hired in cities nationwide to consult on music policy topics like noise level disputes. They have also worked on similar census projects in Charlotte, Dallas, D.C., and Seattle. Compared to the 2015 focus on the industry dollar amounts, the new census' expanded questions will also examine social and cultural aspects of Austin music. No personal data will be requested, with respondents submitting anonymously. Results will be released publicly, in a series of infographics and a report, later this year.

The rollout listed support from 19 Austin orgs including ACC, SIMS, EQ Austin, and the city's **Economic Development Department** – inviting more partners to reach out. Music Commissioner Jonathan "Chaka" Mahone, also behind POC support

group DAWA, criticized Music Cities online for not engaging "several key BIPOC-led" groups prior to the launch. This week, the census added 19 more new partners like the **Long** Center, Latin Music Coalition Austin, and **Urban Artist Alliance.**

Back in February 2021, the Music **Commission** supported another survey aimed at musicians in partnership with local data-gathering nonprofit Measure. Mobley, who helped launch the Black Austin Musicians' Collective and presented the survey to the commission, tells the Chronicle he isn't able to share results yet. He also declined to comment on the new Sound Music Cities census.

THE LIVE MUSIC FUND IS GOING TO TAKE HOW LONG?

Due to unfilled city jobs, the city Music Division says the long-awaited Live Music Fund will not roll out applications until a vear from now, in May 2023, Economic Development Director Svlnovia Holt-Rabb cited staff shortages, including 20 empty positions in her own department, in a presentation to the Austin Music Commission earlier this month. The Live Music Fund was created by an increase in hotel occupancy taxes in 2019, since accruing a \$3 million budget.

"Musicians have been waiting for a long time," said commission Chair Anne-**Charlotte Patterson**, expressing concerns. "The musicians and music organizations, we've been discussing this since 2019 - so 2023, that's four years [later]."

The program will offer small grants of \$5,000 to \$10,000 to musicians and independent promoters to fund their own proiects. In addition to putting on live music performances, the program can also fund typical album expenses like recording, music videos, publishing/sync licensing, digital distribution, as well as vinyl, CD, and cassette production. Alongside musicians, independent promoters, who must not be contractually tied to one venue, will be eligible for the program.

In the next year, city staff will select an outside contractor to administer the grants, as well as another music-focused subcontractor to help process the expected 1,200



to 2,500 applicants. Music Division Manager Erica Shamaly said her department learned from last year's Austin Music Disaster Relief Grant, which was administered by the Long Center, that "to have one third-party do absolutely everything is a lot of work." Commissioners expressed concerns about grant funds being eaten up by the contractor's fee, which won't be determined until later in the solicitation process. After its first year, Shamaly said the annual program will be able to roll out more quickly.

"We simply don't have enough staff [to do it all in house]," said Shamaly. "We have lost a lot of staff, just like a lot of different organizations throughout the country, so we're just doing the best we can. We think this is the best path forward to get it done as quickly as possible in the way that [the commission1 envisioned."

The city expects to award 250 to 500 applicants, reflecting the commission's goal to fund many musicians with small grants. After divided opinions on whether the Live Music Fund should support venues, the program will not accept venue applications until its second year. Discussions were also extended by commission efforts to build equity requirements into the program, led by Commissioner Mahone.

"The timeline, while it's not expedient, it's realistic," said Mahone. "We took a long time to deal with a lot of the equity things that have been wrong in the past, [which] could have maybe been done faster in a lot of people's eyes, but I think this is going to be effective."

HAAM SEEKS CITY FUNDING & PARTNERS WITH PNC BANK

At a meeting of City Council's Public **Health Committee** earlier this month, the **Health Alliance for Austin Musicians** requested \$1 million in city funding to continue providing free and low-cost health care to local musicians. The growing organization currently serves around 3,000 musicians, and enrolled more than 220 new musicians in just the first quarter of 2022. CEO Paul Scott

noted that the nonprofit annually takes around half a million dollars out of its reserves to cover members' insurance premiums.

"We'd like to enter into a conversation with the city of Austin to see how we can continue to invest in our musicians and their health care, as well as leverage the health care dollars available [through] the work we're doing," Scott said. "We'd like to either see a referral to the city manager's office or a budget resolution for funds."

Adding another resource for members, HAAM also announced a new partnership with PNC Bank last week to provide musicians with workshops on managing personal and business finances. PNC also presents the annual fundraiser HAAM Day incoming Sept. 13, and sponsors the HAAM **Corporate Battle of the Bands** – open to the public on Thursday, June 2, at ACL Live. In the past year, the bank has expanded music partnerships with ACL Fest as well as a residency program at the new PNC Plaza outside of ACL Live, in collaboration with **Austin Music Foundation.**

A Spontaneous Trip to South Africa Leads to Mobley's Robin Hood Moment in "themesong" Video

"My career as an artist notwithstanding, I'm a pretty practically minded person," Mobley reveals.

So when multimedia artist Moyo Oyelola invited the one-man band to Johannesburg on short notice to shoot a music video, it was his nature to say no ... at first.

"But then, after I got off the phone with him, I was sitting there and thinking: 'What did you think your life would be like? What did you hope your life would be like, when you decided to be an artist? And how was this not it?' So I called him back and was like, 'Okay, let me try to find a ticket and see if I can make it work."

Mobley, the vocalist and multi-instrumentalist known for coupling his guitar and synth-driven pop bangers with narrative-heavy, film-quality visuals, threw caution to the wind: buying a plane ticket four days out, packing a camera and "a suspicious number of balaclavas," and jetting to South Africa's largest city, where he didn't know a soul, for a whirlwind five-day shoot with the Nigeria-born. Austin-raised Oyelola.

At first, nothing came easy. Day one saw constant rain and little preproduction panned out on day two – leaving Mobley at stomach ulcer-level stress. Then, everything fell into place. A local producer helped them assemble the main cast – which they rounded out with people they met on the street – striking locations were scouted through word-of-mouth connections, and a cohesive group of artists working on a dance routine at a community center signed to play the protagonist's ski-masked squad. The ensuing video was shot entirely the following day.

"I went halfway around the world to where I didn't know anybody and I'm really, really happy with the way it came out," Mobley says of the "themesong" video, released Friday.

The visually arresting clip unfolds with a family being threatened with a harsh eviction, then follows a masked vigilante – played by Mobley – who exacts revenge on the callous landlord and returns their seized property. The character in the video, a modern-day take on the Robin Hood archetype, will factor into its creator's forthcoming work.

Mobley, currently on a tour of the northern U.S. with Arkells, began conceptualizing the video when eviction protections in Austin were expiring and people were being forced out of their homes.

The concept that I really wanted to work with in this video was juxtaposing different kinds of actions where, arguably, the more harmful ones don't tend to get characterized as violence - like inarguable violence of trying to kick a family out of their home that they need to stay out of the elements," he explains, "This dynamic exists in the United States, too, in a different way, but in a place like South Africa where the Indigenous Black population is just grossly impoverished and on the losing end of a real wealth and income inequity, there's that added layer of violence: Not only are you trying to kick me out of this house, but it's on land that was stolen in the first place. And, you know, we're scarcely two decades out from the formal end of apartheid there. So the kind of freshness of all that stuff is still very, very clear and very salient.

"So, anyway, I wanted to put two different kinds of violence next to each other and then challenge the audience to say which one is wrong."

The Joy of Sect

After a relapse into addiction quietly broke up Street Sects, the duo has exorcised their demons



Languishing in the corner, monopolizing the dust that might have otherwise spread to the grime-ridden walls, were boxes upon boxes of pills that Leo Ashline didn't need to take. Gabapentin, America's 10th most-commonly prescribed medication, is a supposedly non-habit-forming anticonvulsant drug frequently given out to sufferers of anxiety. Even stockpiled as the central ornament in the bedroom of a reformed drug addict, the collection seemed like harmless furniture.

In late 2019, after a lifetime of independent coping, Ashline finally sought pharmaceutical care for depression. Gabapentin - though an integral garnish in his broader psychiatric cocktail - seemed right away to lag behind its chemical co-conspirators in setting Ashline's mood. Without halting the prescription, he removed the pills from his diet.

What happened next happened quickly. The calendar turned, and Ashline found himself out of a bartending job, trapped in a shared house that nauseated him, and in a band whose canceled tour dates meant no distraction from an increasingly intense album-writing process. The only reliable constants besides the steadily mounting stress were the steadily mounting pillboxes that promised to relieve it.

It took just one bad shift at his miserable Amazon delivery gig to deliver four gabapentin into his esophagus. Ashline soon found himself leaning on the pills after work each day, always consuming enough to "black out" in an approximation of alcoholic inebriation. When the realization that he was abusing the medication



blearily occurred to him, it was already too late. Driving late one night, high on gabapentin, he impulsively pulled over to "pick up something harder" and lost nine years of sobriety in an instant.

"Every awful thing that I had stopped using, it resumed like I never stopped," Ashline recalls. "Like Street Sects never happened."



"I was ready to give up/ But instead I just drank up."

There exists another "Leo Ashline" who never got clean and likely never will. In the minds of experimental music fans who know him only through the songs he releases as one half of Street Sects, the vocalist is forever an avatar for the sink trap of addiction. Sometimes warbling in an unsettled Peter Murphy croon, more often screeching in savage abandon, Ashline, 42, inhabits howlingly despondent characters whose outward aggression is matched only by their inward loathing. With multi-instrumentalist Shaun Ringsmuth, 38, designing the electro-abrasive architecture, the duo conjures an urban landscape of monochromatic bleakness - unmistakably the product of artists who've traversed it for real.

I was first introduced to Street Sects as an indie-rock-obsessed high school senior. Insufficiently framed by a fellow pimply nerd as being "sorta Death Grips-ish," their clattering, sample-based onslaught and obvious authenticity (call it the "Jesus, how fucked are these dudes??" quotient) immediately scared the shit out of me. With time, their detailed songwriting, curious melodicism, and tragic catharsis brought me out from under my blankets and into awed fascination. Six years later, prepping for this profile, panicking over which extreme metal tee to wear, I'm no less intimidated. We're gathering to talk about their new 7-inch single, Gentrification V: Whitewashed - the final installment of a series begun in 2014 and the duo's first release in four years. Problem is, the single's two songs were completed eons ago, and Street Sects has spent countless interviews since 2018 hazily alluding to the same unannounced third album. Even if the band didn't sneer at my goofy fandom, was there really a new story for us to discuss?

The day brings two surprises. First, these are some lovely and not-at-all-fucked dudes. We meet early in the morning at the band's practice space at Mosaic Sound Collective - Ashline coming directly off a night shift as a security guard and still wearing his white-collared uniform. A compliment from Ringsmuth immediately validates my choice of a Converge shirt. In no time, the duo is spreading banter on everything from Roxy Music albums to 20-year-old memories of Trail of Dead shows ... but not, crucially, themselves. When an unexpected disclosure breaks the lull all at once, the band seems as shocked as me.

"Going into this," Ringsmuth says, "I wondered if we were gonna somehow Band-Aid over what happened, sorta awkwardly get around it."

"I would rather we just be honest here," adds Ashline. "Let's not have this come out in a fucking press release a month from now."

Surprise number two? Street Sects spent the last year and a half broken up.

"You want a story?" Ashline asks. "You got one."



In some ways, it's a miracle Street Sects ever developed to the point of a meaningful dissolution. Ashline and Ringsmuth first met in turn-of-the-millennium Florida while sharing shifts in a Barnes & Noble Starbucks. Bonding through alcoholism first, shared musical ambitions second, the duo spent the next decade traveling across the nation, logging time in various go-nowhere bands as Ashline's addictions steadily worsened. Their relationship almost derailed permanently upon arriving in Austin in 2011. With vivid terror, Ringsmuth recalls being forced to exile his "out of control" roommate lest he get dragged down with him.

Thankfully, a stint in rehab pulled Ashline back from the suicidal brink, and Ringsmuth accepted his friend's proposal that they give their partnership its fateful second go. As the younger man familiarized himself with electronics (self-critical to the end, this accomplished producer insists he remains a flailing novice) the duo developed a songwriting process rooted in equal exchange. Ringsmuth develops music with Ashline's "character" in mind. Ashline provides crucial notes on each of Ringsmuth's fragments and works on lyrics to match their unique moods. When each musician functions as the other's irreplaceable muse, falling off the wagon isn't an option.

No longer just a reason for Ashline to "get out of bed each morning," Streets Sects began its unexpected path to cult crossover when 2014's self-released Gentrification entries captured the attention of beloved experimental imprint the Flenser. With the label demanding an album, the duo shelved their single series and quickly scraped together their 2016 kickoff, End Position. To this day, they continue to hear from listeners who find comfort for their troubles in the LP's raw, unblinking torment.

Unfortunately, Street Sects themselves could locate no similar solace - and not just because Ringsmuth continues to dismiss their modern classic debut as "amateurish." 2018 follow-up The Kicking Mule tumbled out to neither partner's satisfaction.

According to the duo, the record hovers timidly between "noise" and "melody" – an outcome they pin to the clash of two incompatible anxieties: to maintain a steamrolling release schedule but also to immediately buck expectations and dodge careerlong stasis in heavy music. No matter how bad the music started to sound, making it felt worse.

"All these deadlines and pressure," says Ringsmuth. "It stopped being fun."

"And if it's not satisfying, why the fuck are you even doing it? You're certainly losing the money you put into it," Ashline says. "And we began really sacrificing quality of life for it."

It'd be a stretch to say Street Sects has ever really lived comfortably. Prioritizing their passion has meant a decade suffering cold showers and a revolving door of disreputable roommates. But even with that history, the 12th and Pennsylvania "shithole" that a sudden housing flip forced the duo to domesticate in May 2019 took a crucial toll on their mental health. Though haunted both by the troubling histories of past residents and the current presence of literal toilet-dwelling rats, there was no conjuring the building's cursed energies toward the creation of vital new music. Instead, with the hallways too filthy and hot to even speak in, LP No. 3 progress stalled. By the time Ashline relapsed in October 2020, Ringsmuth had already fled to South Austin. For the producer - three years sober himself - distance only made the immediate cessation of contact easier.

"There was terror, uncertainty," recalls Ringsmuth of his feelings toward his friend's descent. "Mostly? Just anger."

Ashline cleaned up the following January; he credits Patsy Bouressa and SIMS Foundation with saving his life, getting him into Recovery Unplugged despite having no insurance. Even still, texts and emails to his musical partner remained unanswered. Though wary of how new Streets Sects material might be received without Ringsmuth, it was crucial to Ashline's recovery that he press forward writing and recording music. There was liberation in treading far outside the dismal confines of Street Sects - writing "goofy fruit-pop" songs and working with professional producers (including a few tantalizing tracks with Xiu Xiu's Jamie Stewart).

"The sillier the music, the more fun I had singing it," Ashline recalls. "I started to enjoy creating again, so I started to enjoy life again."

Ringsmuth remained productive as well, all the while wondering if he would get dragged into another band before Street Sects inevitably resurfaced without him.

"I had made peace with that," he recalls. "That's how incredibly angry I was."

But as 17 months passed with neither eventuality manifesting, the unrealized "hopes and dreams" of Street Sects proved difficult to shake off. After much thought, Ringsmuth sent a text of reconciliation to Ashline on February 18, 2022, mirroring Ashline's own message to him nearly a decade earlier. By incredible coincidence, the singer had earlier that day updated the band's socials for the first time since 2018 to announce "The Joy of Sect" – a long brewing collaboration with UK industrialists HEALTH that the duo had incorrectly assumed to be their final song together.

With *Gentrification V* arriving at last – the oppressive energy of unreleased work finally exorcized – there's nothing to distract from LP No. 3. But this time, the duo insists they aren't setting a bunch of deadlines and diving into recording. The "proper sequel to *End Position*" will arrive when it's ready, with no regrets. If that means another four years of waiting, so be it. You can't rush balanced living.

"What we have so far is absolutely the best sounding stuff we've done yet," raves Ashline.

Anticipating Ringsmuth's hangdog response, I look over to see him shaking his head.

"I'm not ready to say that yet."



After our interview, Leo Ashline will return to his sparkling apartment for some after-work rest. If there's any sort of threat piled in a corner awaiting him, at worst it's an unhappy gift from his new dog. Should he need to throw off his worries after a rough night, there's one artificial remedy I know he'll take. He'll remove his uniform, step into the bathroom – confident in it being rodent free – and take a long, hot, shower.

"To most people, quality of life, balance, sustainability – those are just normal things, but I'm not taking it for granted," Ashline says. "You can't hang everything on a band and let the rest of your life go to seed."

A. SINCLAIR RECRUITS FRIENDS FOR SOUTH **PADRE TRIP**

A. Sinclair's fifth LP leads with "Lean Into It," a mellow guitar strum and eerie, creaking wash subtly haunting the background, as if the songwriter's mind is always threatening underneath as he sits alone in the bedroom. And then comes the eruption, pure catharsis, and terror in the screaming disillusion. "God damn, that is fucking bleak, man," he marvels before the tape clicks off.

If last year's Sunshine Ghost, which found Aaron Sinclair managing all the instruments

himself, rolled mellow and contemplative, South Padre (released via Mr. Pink) boils restlessly eclectic and notably collaborative. With producer Justin Douglas, Sinclair recruited coconspirators recording remotely across the country, including Sean Murphy's tortured opener. Michael Booher's vocals sink into the dreamy beach twang of "Laid Back," and Dave Vicini from Kentucky's Beat Awfuls winds through late-night lo-fi thoughts on "They Were Listening," while Strange Pains downstrokes the intense closer, "Information Inn."

The myriad voices only emphasize the sense of a psyche fragmented and competing for attention in this age of late-stage pandemic and isolation. "We Got Time" slices Neil Young. and the easy country melody of "How Things Got Done" hearkens Sinclair's former Frank Smith days. Moments of somber beauty like "Taking Cues (Something Clicks)" and levity with rollicking, weed-dealing escape plan "City Life" keep the album from burdening under the heavy weight of Sinclair's emotional lyrical punch. Sinclair holds it all together impressively, following where those voices need to take him. - Doug Freeman



Quin NFN employs a different approach on latest single "Roku" by dissenting from his usual high-energy deliveries. On the April release, the new EMPIRE signee at times calmly rhymes in a way similar to that of the "Supa Dupa Flow" most commonly associated with nascent Big Sean. The Supa Dupa style typically involves punctuating metaphors with one word related to that metaphor (i.e., "Gold Noggin - Goku" or "We on his ass - Fruit of Loom"). The frustratingly short "Roku" marks the East Austin emcee's second single under EMPIRE as he builds toward his first project since 2020's Quincho. - Derek Udensi

DENIS O'DONNELL RIDES *OLD WAGON ROAD*

In setting up the Sagebrush and White Horse (not to mention the erstwhile Hard Luck Lounge and his time at Hole in the Wall), Denis O'Donnell has always given songwriters a home in Austin. Increasingly, he's taking his own turn in the song swap, showcased with new EP Old Wagon Road. Stripped down and patient, the five songs unfold with surprising tenderness, his vocals gentle with just enough wear to live in. The longing on "Brand New" and "Small World" envelops, and slow regret of "Last Words" lingers, but it's the loving touch of "Keep the Wings" and "Song for Lu" that catches O'Donnell's openheartedness. - Doug Freeman

ALEXALONE FOLLOWS BORIS' "RAINBOW"

Alex Peterson first saw Boris perform a 2014 drone set at End of an Ear. Influence of the Japanese band's unencumbered voyages through space and texture arises in the local's output as Alexalone. Via Polyvinyl, Peterson recalls: "I had never seen that type of music played live before ... CDs were falling off of the shelves from the volume and vibrations, and in the middle of the set they switched it up and played 'Rainbow.'" Alexalone now interprets the 2007 Boris track (with guitarist Michio Kurihara). Deference to heroes inspires switchups, as instrumentalist Mari Maurice leads vocals and Drewsky Hulett takes a serrated guitar solo.

JONATHAN TERRELL GETS "BETTER FOR YOU"

Since 2020's Westward, Jonathan Terrell has been on a tear. Anthemic singles "Highway" and "Vagabond" honed the local country rocker's swaggering style, while touring with Midland has taken his gravel-voiced, hip-shimmying show international. Now the songwriter has signed with the new powerhouse label collaboration between Range Music and Virgin, and dished the delicious new single "Better for You." With the Beau Bedford-produced song, Terrell takes an almost Jimmy Webb turn, classic heartbreak behind his aching voice. The video, produced by and featuring Shakey Graves along with Stephanie Hunt, echoes in B&W regret. - Doug Freeman

HONG KONG WIGS WANT 'NOBODY BUT YOU"

Hong Kong Wigs' new single embraces shades of Seventies NYC glam and early Eighties punk (the vocal interplay of Jon Fichter and Anastasia Wright evokes John Doe and Exene Cervenka of X) and yet it sounds eternally vital. It's an incontrovertible fact that three is a magic number in rock & roll and HKW summit that power-trio supremacy with catchy tortured-love lyrics and Adam Galvan's tom-tom-tickling drum break. A stylish video, directed by Dave Creaney, includes the gang cheesing in a bar bathroom shots that necessitated installing a mirror in the Hole in the Wall's pisser, which the community thanks them for. - Kevin Curtin

GRUPO FANTASMA FEAT. JOE BATAAN

Paramount Theatre, Friday 27

Nine deep and 21 years vested. Austin's Grammy-winning Latin brass locomotive Grupo Fantasma backs Spanish Harlem soul pioneer Joe Bataan one time only - solamente una vez! - as curated by Paramount



booker/music apostle Zach Ernst. Bassist Greg Gonzalez answered a crucial question.

Austin Chronicle: Describe the importance of Joe Bataan and this opportunity for locals to experience him live and in the flesh?

Greg Gonzalez: Joe is an Afro-Filipino, Smithsonian-recognized musician, vocalist, and songwriter who grew up in East Harlem in the Forties and Fifties. He spent time in a local street gang and ended up in prison. Upon release, he turned to music with a conviction to change his life. He soon formed his first band of teenaged Puerto Rican musicians, including Willie Colón and Bobby Valentín, blending the local boogaloo, salsa, and doo-wop.

At 19, he released "Gypsy Woman" on Fania Records and [scored a] crossover hit. In 1973, he combined salsa, disco, and soul, and co-founded the Salsoul label, one of the most memorable imprints of the disco era. A chance encounter there led him to record one of the first rap songs, "Rap-O Clap-O."

Joe represents one of the last remaining members of the New York music community whose innovations and experimentations led to some of the most influential Latin music. His musical legacy reflected our own as an outlier who embraced a more expansive pan-American sound, unafraid to take chances and mix genres. - Raoul Hernandez

STRAND OF OAKS, PAT FINNERTY

Antone's, Friday 27

For God's sake, support newly sober songwriter Timothy Showalter on his eighth album as Strand of Oaks, In Heaven, and see how you don't have to be in your cups to be or create fun. On his soaring folk-rockcountry LP, Showalter tastefully (for rock people) smashes synths while aiming for emotional generosity specifically. He lands on twinkling, comforting Americana and pop constructions alongside Nick Cave- and John Prine-inspired meditations. It's all optimistic, even when he's singing about how he doesn't have his buddy, Stan - his late cat - anymore. Professional shit talker Pat Finnerty opens. - Christina Garcia

CHRISTELLE BOFALE, EGAUX SELLS

Radio Coffee & Beer. Saturday 28

Christelle Bofale, one of Austin's most brilliant singer-songwriter/guitarists, is moving on to NYC. With only six recorded tracks on Father/Daughter Records, Bofale's solo performances and songs are so consistently moving that fans, like myself, likely know all the words to every single one. Not a second spared, her soft works in indie rock move like water (under appropriately titled debut EP Swim Team) through innovative structure, highlighted in the quintessential seven-minute "U Ouchea." Locally based Egaux Sells, newly titled outlet of BluMoon's Kendra Sells, joins the goodbye show following last year's elegantly exploratory LP All in Your Head. - Rachel Rascoe

LIVE MUSIC REVIVAL FEST

Empire, Antone's, Saturday 28-Sunday 29

A regionally focused, genre-flexible, affordable (\$25-45) fest. LMR kicks off Saturday at Empire with a stacked Black Austin Musicians' Collective day party (11:30am-5:15pm) including kaleidoscopic rockers Kalu & the Electric Joint; punks Pleasure Venom; lyricists Ifé Neuro, the Teeta, and Magna Carda; and R&B contemporist Daniel Fears. That night, Screwed Up Click veteran Lil Flip (7:15pm) highlights a bill headlined by local crunkstepper Crizzly (midnight). Sunday's 11-hour run at Antone's encompasses bedroom-popcrafters Fuvk (3:45pm), punk oddballs Big Bill (7:45pm), and Jackie Venson's melodic vibrancy (8:45pm). Concurrently, Empire taps laid-back neo-soul jazzer KindKeith (3:15pm) and dynamic singer/rapper Abhi the Nomad (9:30pm).

WOMEN IN JAZZ SPRING

Monks Jazz Club, Sunday 29

Presented by scene avatar Monks Jazz Club. the organization's semiannual concert helps fill the gaps. Singers Melissa Briggs and Candance Bellamy and trumpeter Rachael Spencer team up with Hart for round robin showcases, backed by pianist Juliana Silveira, bassist Jessica Valls, and drummer Masumi Jones. In-person tickets went fast. but Monks streams live. - Michael Toland

JAD FAIR. ON BEING AN ANGEL Chess Club. Tuesday 31

The convergence of alternative elder statesmen, up-and-coming slowcore, and Sublime covers could only be the variety-packing work of offbeat series Swass Night. Half Japanese half Jad Fair - marking a notable visitor to the increasingly busy little stage at Red River's new Chess Club - totes last year's first-time U.S. reissue of Kramer collab A History of Crying. Last month, On Being an Angel vocalist Paige Applin joined the Lemonheads onstage in L.A. for "Bit Part" after befriending Evan Dando during the Nineties act's SXSW visit. Tuesday, Applin plays acoustic after Bradfish, aka Carlton Bostock of Lo Country's take on Sublime - Quiche DJs. Rachel Rascoe
